# ELECTION DAY UPDATE

## LEGISLATION

As we approach the forthcoming November 3, 2020, Presidential Election, many Detroiters are being safe by opting out of the traditional Election Day experience of casting their ballots at their neighborhood polling location and choosing to vote by absentee ballot. The 2018 measure (Proposition 3) that Michigan voters approved allows anyone who is registered to vote to request an absentee ballot without reason.

Although Prop 3 is a welcomed victory for our voters, it offers minimal administrative relief to election administrators throughout Michigan. It offers no significant adjustment to the anticipated increase in absentee voter request. The measure coupled with COVID-19 guarantees that Detroit will count more than 150,000 absentee ballots for the November 3rd Presidential Election. As a result, Election Day will be more like Election Week.

## THE CHALLENGE

In Michigan, our barriers to a successful election are legislative. No matter who the clerk is or which municipality or township being considered – because of our antiquated election laws, we know for certain that:

1. The ability to RECOUNT all ballots will be nearly impossible, simply because people make mistakes.
2. Whenever we anticipate counting large volumes of absentee ballots, Election Day results will not happen at the end of the day.

3. At this time all voted absentee ballots mailed will not be counted simply because if received and postmarked after 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, it cannot be processed regardless of the postmark and time.

## THE SOLUTION

In all instances, for absentee voting and post-election recounts, Michigan legislators should take a hard look at what other states have done to ease the burden on election administrators and develop new laws for processing returned absentee ballots and handling precincts that are declared uncountable during a recount. It should not take federal efforts to recognize the deficiencies in Michigan Election Laws to create a national policy to unify the handling of absentee ballots and administering of recounts. However, if it does, federal policies will play a major role in ensuring administrators have the tools they need to effectively manage the democratic process.

## WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

As a Detroit voter, you can be assured that the Detroit Department of Elections is working to ensure full access to the process and that Election Day will be known as Election Week; that way we can provide a seamless, unrushed process that will hold up to the standards of post-election scrutiny.

Don't be misled by mainstream media scare tactics. Rather, be safe and vote like your life depends on it – because it does!

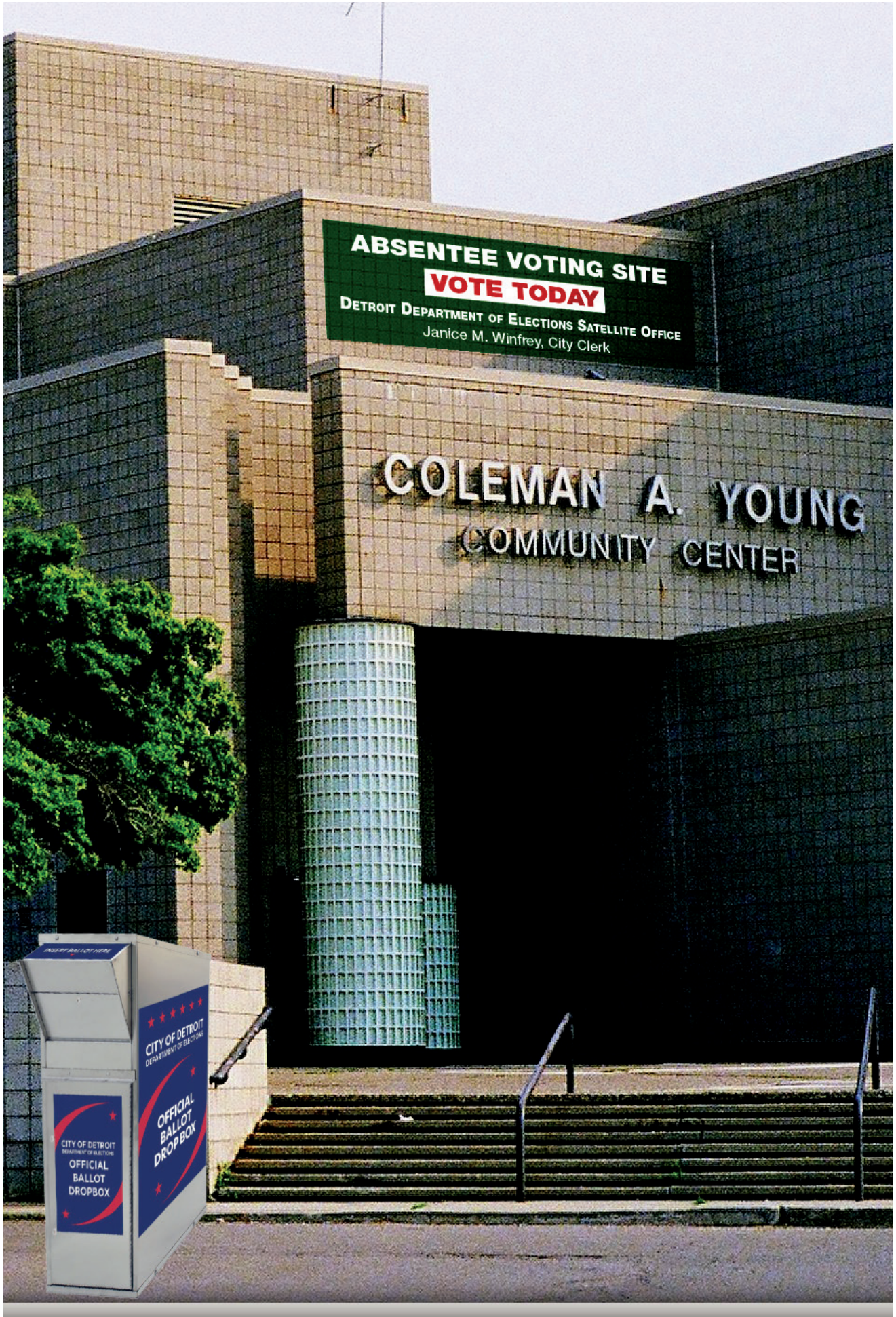

**TO VOTE:** Completely darken the oval opposite each choice as shown: 

**IMPORTANT:** To mark your ballot, use only a black or blue ink pen. **DO NOT USE ANY OTHER INK COLOR!**

**PARTISAN SECTION:** To vote the partisan section of the ballot, you may cast a “straight ticket,” a “split ticket” or a “mixed ticket.”

**Straight Ticket:** Vote the party of your choice. Nothing further need be done in the partisan section.

**Split Ticket:** You may vote a straight ticket AND vote for individual candidates of your choice.

**Mixed Ticket:** Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office.

**NONPARTISAN and PROPOSAL SECTIONS** of the ballot (if any) must be voted separately.

**DO NOT** vote for more candidates than indicated under each office title.

**WRITE-IN CANDIDATES:** To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write or place the name of that candidate in the blank space provided and completely darken the voting target area. **This must be done even if you cast a straight party vote.** Do not cast a write-in vote for a candidate whose name is already printed on the ballot for that office.

**CHECK BOTH SIDES OF BALLOT:** This ballot has two sides. Be certain to check the reverse side of the ballot.

**WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING:** Place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve so that votes cannot be seen and the numbered stub is visible. Return the ballot to the election official stationed at the tabulator. (If voting by absentee ballot, follow the instructions provided by the clerk for returning the ballot.)

**NOTE:** If you make a mistake, return your ballot to the election official and obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to erase or correct any marks made in error.

**ভোট দেওয়ার জন্য:** প্রতিটি পছন্দ মতো করে ডিম্বাকৃতি পুরোপুরি অন্ধকার করুন: ●

**গুরুত্বপূর্ণ:** আপনার ব্যালট চিহ্নিত করতে শুধুমাত্র একটি কালো বা নীল কালি কলম ব্যবহার করুন। অন্য কোনও কালি রঙ ব্যবহার করবেন না!

**পার্টিশন বিভাগ:** ব্যালটের পক্ষপাতিত্বকারী অংশটি ভোট দিতে, আপনি একটি “স্ট্রেট টিকিট”, “বিভক্ত টিকিট” বা একটি “মিশ্র টিকিট” দিতে পারেন।

**সোজা টিকিট:** আপনার পছন্দের পার্টিকে ভোট দিন। পার্টিশন বিভাগে আর কিছু করার দরকার নেই।

**বিভক্ত টিকিট:** আপনি একটি সরাসরি টিকিট ভোট দিতে পারেন এবং আপনার পছন্দের পৃথক প্রার্থীদের ভোট দিতে পারেন।

**মিশ্র টিকিট:** প্রতিটি অফিসে আপনার পছন্দের পৃথক প্রার্থীদের ভোট দিন।

ব্যালটের নন পার্টিশন এবং প্রস্তাবিত বিভাগগুলি (যদি থাকে) আলাদাভাবে ভোট দিতে হবে।

প্রতিটি অফিসে শিরোনামের অধীনে নির্দেশিত চেয়ে বেশি প্রার্থীকে ভোট দিবেন না।

**লিখিতভাবে প্রার্থনা:** ব্যালটে মুদ্রিত নয় এমন প্রার্থীর পক্ষে ভোট দেওয়ার জন্য, প্রদত্ত ফাঁকা জায়গায় সেই প্রার্থীর নাম লিখুন বা রাখুন এবং ভোটের লক্ষ্য অঞ্চলটি পুরোপুরি অন্ধকার করুন। আপনি সরাসরি দলের ভোট দিলেও অবশ্যই এটি করা উচিত। যে প্রার্থীর নাম ইতিমধ্যে সেই অফিসের ব্যালটে মুদ্রিত রয়েছে তাদের প্রার্থীর পক্ষে লিখিতভাবে ভোট দিবেন না।

**ব্যালটের ছ’দিক থেকে চেক করুন:** এই ব্যালটের দুটি দিক রয়েছে। ব্যালটের বিপরীত দিকটি পরীক্ষা করতে ভুলবেন না।

**আপনি যখন ভোটিং সম্পূর্ণ করেছেন:** ব্যালটটি গোপনীয়তার মধ্যে রাখুন যাতে ভোটগুলি দেখা যায় না এবং সংখ্যায়ুক্ত স্টার্টাট দৃশ্যমান হয়। ট্যাবুলেটারে অবস্থিত নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তাকে ব্যালট ফিরিয়ে দিন। (অনুপস্থিত ব্যালটে ভোট দিয়ে থাকলে ব্যালট ফিরিয়ে দেওয়ার জন্য কেবল প্রদত্ত নির্দেশনা অনুসরণ করুন।)

**দ্রষ্টব্য:** আপনি যদি ভুল করেন তবে আপনার ব্যালটটি নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তার কাছে ফিরিয়ে দিন এবং একটি নতুন ব্যালট পান। ত্রুটিযুক্ত কোনও চিহ্ন মুছে ফেলার বা সংশোধন করার চেষ্টা করবেন না।

## الانتخابات العامة

**للتصويت:** املأ البيضاوي تماماً مقابل كل خيار كما هو موضح ●

**هام:** لتعليم الاقتراع، استخدم قلم حبر أسود أو أزرق فقط. لا تستخدم أي لون آخر!

**القسم الحزبي:** للتصويت على القسم الحزبي في بطاقة الاقتراع، يمكنك الإدلاء بـ “بطاقة مباشرة” أو “بطاقة مقسمة” أو “بطاقة مختلطة”.

**بطاقة مباشرة:** صوت للحزب الذي تختاره. لا حاجة لعمل المزيد في القسم الحزبي.

**بطاقة مقسمة:** يمكنك التصويت على بطاقة مباشرة والتصويت لمرشحين فرديين من اختيارك.

**بطاقة مختلطة:** التصويت للمرشحين الفرديين من اختيارك في كل مكتب.

يجب التصويت على أقسام غير حزبية وقسم الاقتراع (إن وجد) بشكل منفصل.

لا تصوت لمرشحين أكثر مما هو مذكور تحت كل منصب.

**اكتب المرشحين:** للتصويت لمرشح لم يُطبع اسمه على بطاقة الاقتراع، اكتب أو ضع اسم ذلك المرشح في المساحة الفارغة المتوفرة وقم بتعقيم منطقة التصويت تماماً. يجب أن يتم ذلك حتى لو أدليت بصوت حزبي مباشر. لا تدلي بصوت مكتوب لمرشح تمت طباعة اسمه بالفعل على بطاقة الاقتراع لهذا المنصب.

**تحقق من جانبي البطاقة:** هذا الاقتراع له وجهان. تأكد من التحقق من الجانب الآخر من بطاقة الاقتراع.

**عند إتمام التصويت:** ضع بطاقة الاقتراع في غلاف السرية بحيث لا يمكن رؤية الأصوات ويكون كعب الاقتراع المرقم مرتباً. إعادة ورقة الاقتراع إلى مسؤول الانتخابات المتمركز في الجدول. (في حالة التصويت عن طريق الاقتراع الغيابي، اتبع التعليمات التي قدمها الكاتب لإعادة الاقتراع)

**ملاحظة:** إذا ارتكبت خطأً، فأعد بطاقة اقتراعك إلى مسؤول الانتخابات واحصل على بطاقة اقتراع جديدة. لا تحاول محو أو تصحيح أي علامات خطأً.
