Background

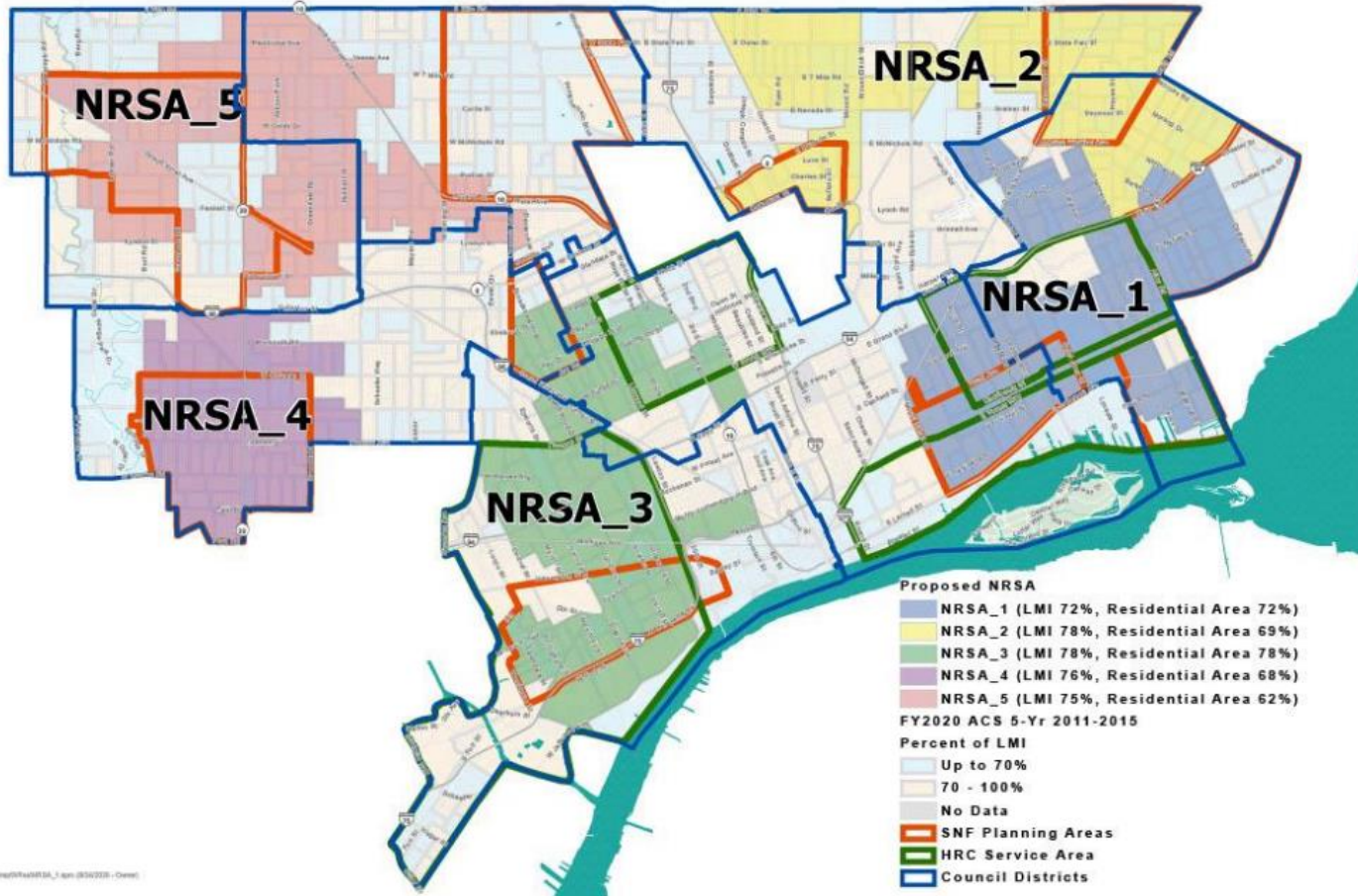
- Post bankruptcy, the City applied to adopt a Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area (NRSA) Plan.
- A NRSA plan is a strategic way to focus CDBG dollars in specific areas to support community revitalization efforts.
- In 2015, we were approved for a NRSA plan to focus CDBG dollars in 5 areas (also known as NRSAs) in the City of Detroit, primarily for the benefit of the City's low- and moderate-income population.
- HUD approved the City of Detroit's NRSA renewal plan for 2020-2024.

Background

- As a part of the NRSA plan, HRD planned to implement Empowerment Strategies to promote and facilitate economic growth in the 5 targeted NRSA's.
- Economic Opportunities: Develop and fund programs from multiple sources that create or retain jobs that contribute to the economic stability and self-sufficiency of LMI households and persons
 - Economic Development Programs
 - Motor City Match
 - Grow Detroit's Young Talent
 - HRD is using CBDOs to execute this public service activity

What are the benefits for my organization?

- Potential opportunities through the City of Detroit.
 - Using a CBDO to execute services allows for more flexibility with spending federal dollars
- Exhibit your organization's expertise in the specific areas of the community
 - We want people to know that local Detroiters and organizations are the experts for an array of services.

What is a CBDO?

- Community-Based Development Organization (CBDO)
- *Generally*, a nonprofit that undertakes specific CDBG funded activities
- CBDOs can be for profit or nonprofit organizations, but they *cannot* be a government entity
- CBDOs may be designated as a subrecipient by a grantee

What are eligible activities?

Neighborhood Revitalization

- Activities of sufficient size and scope to have an impact on the decline of a geographic location within the City of Detroit

Community Economic Development

- Activities that increase economic opportunity, principally for persons of low-and-moderate income, or that stimulate or retain businesses or permanent jobs, and projects that consist of one or more such activities that are clearly needed to address a lack of affordable housing accessible to existing or planned jobs

Energy Conservation

- Activities that address energy conservation, principally for the benefit of the low-and-moderate income residents of the City of Detroit

Exhibit A Requirements

51% of governing body membership meet the following criteria:

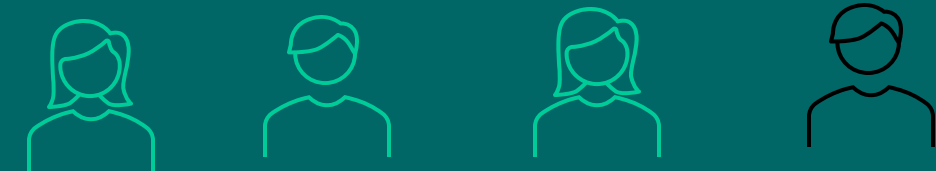
- owners or senior officers of private establishments and other institutions located in and serving its geographic area of operation

OR



- representatives of low- and moderate-income neighborhood organizations located in its geographic area of operation

OR



- Low- and moderate-income residents of its geographic area of operation

Exhibit A Requirements

- An association or corporation organized under State or local law to engage in community development activities
- Its primary purpose is the improvement of the physical, economic, or social environment of its geographic area of operation
- Is either nonprofit or for-profit
- Is not an agency or instrumentality of the City of Detroit

Exhibit A- Requirements

- Requires the members of its governing body to be nominated and approved by the general membership of the organization or by the permanent governing body
- Is not subject to requirements under which its assets revert to the recipient upon dissolution
- Is free to contract for goods and services from vendors of its own choosing

Self Certification Forms A, B, and C

- Upon establishing which individuals of your governing body meet one of the criteria, each member must self certify by completing and submitting the corresponding Self Certification Form.
- Each form must be submitted with your application to be considered for certification.

Self Certification Form A

SELF-CERTIFICATION FORM A LOW- AND MODERATE-INCOME REPRESENTATIVE

A Community Based Development Organization (CBDO) is required to "maintain at least 51 percent of its governing body's membership for low- and moderate-income residents of its geographic area of operation, owners of senior officers of private establishments and other institutions located in and serving its geographic area of operation, or representatives of low- and moderate-income neighborhood organizations located in its geographic area of operation" 24 CFR 570.204 (c)(1)(iv). This form is to be completed by low- and moderate-income residents of the agency's geographic area of operation. The Housing and Revitalization Department requires the following information to determine board member eligibility based on Exhibit "A" section 4 of the CBDO application.

Each low- and moderate-income board member must indicate the number of persons in his/her family, and indicate whether total annual family income exceeds or falls below the listed figure for appropriate family size by indicating a check mark in the boxes below.

NOTE: "Income" is the total annual income of all family members. Additional expected sources of income must be included in this calculation of annual family income. All income for all persons in the family **must** be included in calculating family income.

A Community Based Development Organization (CBDO) is required to "maintain at least 51 percent of its governing body's membership for low- and moderate-income residents of its geographic area of operation, owners or senior officers of private establishments and other institutions located in and serving its geographic area of operation, or representatives of low- and moderate- income neighborhood organizations located in its geographic area of operation" 24 CFR 570.204 (c) (1) (iv).

Board members, who qualify as owners or senior officers of private establishments and other institutions, located in and serving the agency's geographic area of operation should complete this form. The Housing and Revitalization Department requires the following information to determine board member eligibility based on Exhibit "A" section 4 of the CBDO application.

Each owner or senior officer must provide a description of the private establishment or other institution, including the type of services provided by such establishments/institutions, as well as the targeted area of service.

- Is a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) designated by the HOME Investment Partnerships Program by the City of Detroit

Frequently Asked Questions

- What's the difference between a CBDO and a CHDO?
 - A CBDO is to "community development" what a CHDO is to "housing development" (CHDO is short for "Community Housing Development Organization"). Local government have more flexibility in spending their federal HOME housing dollars when they do business with a CHDO. It is possible for a nonprofit to be both a CBDO *and* a CHDO (although the requirements are not identical)
- Can we apply for both applications?
 - You could. Think about how it may best benefit your organization. You can be a CHDO and not a CBDO, but you can be a CBDO and CHDO.
- Will our organization be notified of funding opportunities by becoming a CBDO?
 - Yes, we want to encourage local organizations to become CBDOs so that we can leverage using more federal dollars for projects.

Community Based Development Organization (CBDO)

HUD defines CBDO's as nonprofit organizations that undertake specific kinds of CDBG-funded activities. CBDOs can be for-profit or nonprofit organizations but cannot be governmental entities. CBDO's may be designated as a subrecipient by the grantee. HRD uses CBDO's to execute public service activities. Organizations interested in becoming a CBDO for the City of Detroit must undertake one or more of the following activities: neighborhood revitalization, economic community development, or energy conservation. Your organization must also meet the requirements under [24 CFR 570.204 \(c\)\(1\)](#) or [24 CFR 570.204 \(c\)\(2\)](#). All applications must include a project description, By Laws, and Articles of Incorporation.

HRD certifies all CBDO's annually to ensure that there are no changes within the organization. CBDO's are certified for the entire fiscal year, which is from July 1-June 30 each year.
