36th District Drug Treatment Court

- Mission: to reduce the use and abuse of drugs and/or alcohol, and to reduce recidivism in the drug related criminal activity.
- Purpose: herein DTC was developed to reduce criminal recidivism among nonviolent misdemeanor offenders by eliminating their reliance on mood-altering substances.
 - ► The DTC Program is designed to hold offenders accountable for their behavior while providing them rehabilitative services necessary to maintain a drug free, law –abiding lifestyle.

36th District Drug Treatment Court

INCENTIVES AND SANCTIONS

Responses to behaviors will be individualized and will occur immediately after the behavior. Examples of incentives and sanctions may include:

Target Population & Eligibility

So who belongs in a drug court?

 People who are assessed as having a high risk level of re-offending/failing probation AND as in need of high level of treatment

So who doesn't belong in a drug court?

 People who can more easily complete probation services (low risk to re-offend) or who are not in need of intensive treatment

So how do we know who is who?


