4 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Good afternoon,
5 ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the Board of Police
6 Commissioners meeting. My name is Jerome Warfield,
7 Chairman of our Police Commissioners. Serving with me
8 today is Vice Chair of the Board Commissioner Adela
9 Rivera. Certainly we're glad to have our Chief here,
10 Chief Ralph Godbee. Sir, good to have you.

11 CHIEF GODBEE: Good to be here, sir.

12 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: And our Board
13 Secretary, Mr. George Anthony is here. I'm going to
14 ask if he would just call the roll of our staff?

15 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, Mr. Chair.
16 George Anthony for the record, Secretary to the Board.
17 Our staff members present include Ms. Tina Orr who is
18 our Chief Investigator seated in the front, Ms. Dalph
19 Watson who is our Director of Police Personnel also
20 seated in the front, Ms. Yolonda Caudle who is our
21 Community Relations Coordinator, Officer Kent Cooper
22 from the Office of the Chief Investigator, Mr. Robert
23 Brown who is one of Recorders, Officer Terrance Bell
24 who is recording our proceedings, and Ms. Elizabeth
25 Koller from Hanson Court Reporting Service. That

1 completes the introductions.

2 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you. Is
3 Reverend Pinson here yet? All right. I don't see
4 Reverend Pinson for our invocation. Let us just bow
5 our heads for a moment of silence. Thank you. Amen.

6 AUDIENCE: Amen.

7 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you. We do not
8 have quorum today as you all can see, and so we will
9 not take any official action, but we will be meeting as
10 the committee of the whole. At this time I'm going
11 turn the meeting over to the Chief of Police. Is there
12 anything, sir?

13 CHIEF GODBEE: Just two very two quick
14 things. In light of the story that ran in the Detroit
15 Free Press this past Friday that indicated that there
16 was evidence left at the decommissioned crime lab, I
17 just want to reiterate what was reported out in the
18 press conference at 4:00 p.m., this past Wednesday,
19 that our preliminary findings that Internal Affairs had
20 been in the building prior to the story being placed in
21 the Free Press, there was absolutely no evidence left
22 behind in that building.

23 We'll indicate for the record we are
24 extremely concerned at the conditions of the building,
25 some of the materials left behind and administratively

1 things that as a Department we should have done to
2 close the building out. But suffice it to say I think
3 for the record I think it is important for our citizens
4 and members of the Board to be confident in the fact
5 that our chain of custody relative to evidence has been
6 maintained.

7 We have records to support that, and those
8 documents if they have not been coordinated they are to
9 be turned over to Madam Prosecutor Kim Worthy. I want
10 to reiterate that once the crime lab function was set
11 down, number one, those disciplines that they said were
12 stopped in 2008, in fact, did.

13 And any property that was transferred that
14 had evidentiary value when the unit moved from 2600
15 Brush to Police Headquarters in July 2010 there's a
16 full accounting of all of that evidence which is only
17 biological evidence that's refrigerated and there is a
18 chain of custody protocol that is coordinated with the
19 State Police prior to moving that equipment and moving
20 that evidence.

21 So we're fully confident that after a
22 preliminary walk-through by the Michigan State Police
23 and the FBI that their findings are consistent with
24 what I reported out. We will be anxiously awaiting
25 Michigan State Police to confirmed what we already said

1 on the record.

2 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you, Chief. I
3 appreciate that.

4 CHIEF GODBEE: And just one more thing and
5 then I will acquiesce.

6 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Sure.

7 CHIEF GODBEE: We are prepared on midnight
8 June 13th, Platoon 1, to start on the new approved
9 towing rotation. There were thirty-six tow
10 companies -- thirty-one tow companies that made
11 application for towing relative to the rules and
12 regulations approved by this honorable body and in
13 conjunction with other issues relative to zoning.
14 There are sixteen towers that have been approved
15 currently, ready to go on the 13th.

16 There are fifteen that have not been
17 approved, and the deficiencies that they need to remedy
18 with a deadline of August 1st will be fully
19 communicated by letter starting immediately. And then
20 there will be a meeting convened on or before June 10th
21 with all thirty-one applicants to apprise them of the
22 rules and regulations and reaffirm the edicts of this
23 honorable body relative to towing going forward
24 starting June 13th at midnight. That's all.

25 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: No problem. Thank

1 you. Deputy Chief, do you want to come up? Do you
2 have anything you want to say about that?

3 D.C. LEE: Benjamin F. Lee, Management
4 Services, through the chair. No, I don't.

5 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Did we get the list?

6 D.C. LEE: It was emailed. I just got off
7 the phone with Jim Edwards, the attorney at the Law
8 Department. It was emailed to Celia Banks. I
9 understand she's not here today, but she has it in her
10 in-box for distribution to the Board.

11 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Okay. Great. Thanks
12 a lot. I appreciate that. Thank you, Deputy Chief.
13 You are a warrior, my friend.

14 D.C. LEE: You're welcome.

15 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: I do not have
16 anything else. Again we are not voting. Our next
17 meeting is going to be on Thursday, June 9th, 2011,
18 6:30 p.m., in the Southwest District. We'll be meeting
19 at the Salvation Army in the Mother of Pearl Room. The
20 address 1627 Fort Street, Zip 48226. Yeah, not too far
21 from the post office, right next door to the post
22 office. We'll see you there next week at 6:30 p.m.

23 The time of our meeting now calls for oral
24 communications. If you wish to address the Board of
25 Police Commissioners we ask that you come to the podium

1 and state your name and spell it for us and we ask that
2 you abide by our four minute time limit so we may hear
3 from everybody. You may come at this time.

4 MS. PANELL: Hello, how are you all doing?
5 I'm Sharon Panell. I'm fed up. You know, I begged you
6 for that sign, begged you for that sign. Put it up,
7 two days, the crooks took it down. Two days. I can't
8 even keep up a sign up in my neighborhood, you know.
9 And all I want to do is let them know we're watching.
10 They don't know who's watching but at least -- and we
11 can't keep a sign up in our area.

12 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Did they take both of
13 them, Ms. Panell?

14 MS. PANELL: I didn't get but one.

15 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Oh, you asked for
16 another one? Okay.

17 MS. PANELL: I just attached it to another
18 sign.

19 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Yes, ma'am.

20 MS. PANELL: So the next one I'm going to put
21 in the ground on some wood with some unscrewable screws
22 if I can get another one.

23 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: One of the things we
24 have observed is that when buildings are defaced or the
25 signs removed, the quicker you get them back up the

1 least likely they are to continue that pattern.

2 MS. PANELL: Okay.

3 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: So I will encourage
4 you to continue to pursue that.

5 MS. PANELL: I will, I will, and I appreciate
6 your help.

7 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you.

8 MS. PANELL: Thank you, Mr. D.C.

9 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Anyone else?

10 MS. SMITH: Bernice Smith, political
11 activist. Chief, in regard to the situation about the
12 crime lab, wasn't it someone's responsibility to clean
13 it up? I mean it was in deplorable condition and the
14 fact that you explained to us what happened and
15 everything, but shouldn't they have had a cleanup crew
16 or somebody to come in there so the newspaper wouldn't
17 make it look so bad on your part and on the Police
18 Department?

19 CHIEF GODBEE: No, you're absolutely correct.

20 MS. SMITH: You're down the street from where
21 I live. I'm in the Medical Center.

22 CHIEF GODBEE: Yes, ma'am. For the record, I
23 don't want to preempt Internal Affairs Investigation
24 because those folks as we identify what went wrong,
25 number one, our policy and implications that we will be

1 forwarding to this Board so we can affixed
2 responsibility going forward to make sure that we have
3 a protocol that's a codified policy that whenever DPD
4 vacates a building whether it's a crime lab or
5 precinct, whatever entity it is that we take the
6 appropriate close out procedures. Most importantly not
7 to leave any material behind --

8 MS. SMITH: And it was bullets, weren't they?

9 CHIEF GODBEE: Well, the bullets were for
10 test firing when the lab still had the approved
11 discipline of firearms, but once that discipline was
12 found to have a ten percent error rate and there was a
13 recommendation to close the lab all disciplines were
14 shut down, and the Detroit Police upon the advice of
15 crime laboratory services all of which are provided by
16 State Police.

17 But the entity of the individuals left behind
18 still have the responsibility of certain limited
19 amounts of evidence being the conduit for going to and
20 from the State Police and coming back into the property
21 rooms inventory. But as it goes to the building and
22 it's condition as left behind, the state of chemicals,
23 bullets being left behind, even though we're not doing
24 the proper close out of a building, I think it's
25 extremely important. No excuse for what was done and

1 we will have a complete investigation. We'll take
2 appropriate corrective action.

3 MS. SMITH: All right. One more thing, with
4 Mr. Brown's permission. I gave you a form there, a
5 letter there I got at a meeting today that I left and I
6 thought it was very important and it entails in regards
7 to what the Council is going to do and what the Mayor
8 is going to do in regards to cutting the budget. I
9 understand it's going to be vetoed because they want to
10 cut your budget out and they're going to cut the Fire
11 Department out.

12 CHIEF GODBEE: They want to cut the Detroit
13 Police budget by \$8.3 million. And the Mayor has
14 vetoed their budget that's sent back to him. Now we'll
15 go back to City Council for a vote on Monday. All
16 indications are that City Council will override the
17 Mayor's veto and there will be \$8.3 million cut for
18 police and will, in fact, be in place. At this point
19 our Department's history, the city's history, what
20 we're trying to accomplish, obviously I'm vigorously
21 opposed to any cut to service because number one, first
22 and foremost, from the officer's safety standpoint
23 we're stretched extremely thin.

24 And the reality is if you make the cut to my
25 personnel it's just going to drive the overtime up. So

1 it's a shell game. It's disingenuous to a certain
2 extent to make those cuts there. The real pickle the
3 City is in is not the salary of police officers but
4 it's the benefits and pensions that really drive the
5 costs.

6 MS. SMITH: That's what's disturbing.

7 CHIEF GODBEE: So any negotiations that we
8 would enter into we would like to talk about those
9 things as opposed to making a blanket cut to the Police
10 Department budget. What it does it puts us in a
11 position that we will not be able to hire after
12 July 1st, we will not be able promote which has Consent
13 Judgments implications, because we have a one Sergeant
14 to every ten police officers deployed in the field
15 supervisor ratio that we have to maintain to be in
16 compliance with our policy which has implications on
17 the Consent Judgment Compliance.

18 So it's very shortsighted given what the
19 Mayor was able to negotiate back with the Pension Board
20 in the smoothing out process to realize to
21 sixty-one million dollars worth of gains back that is
22 real revenue that the city will not have to extent.
23 It's really a tough pill for us as a Police Department
24 to swallow.

25 We are completely stretched thin already.

1 We're doing an excellent job. And at some point
2 there's a law of diminishing returns. And if I don't
3 have officers to deploy to the hot spots I can do all
4 the data driven approach I want. I need police
5 officers in the city. Another reality is and then I
6 will conclude my remarks, we have approximately of our
7 3,000 members only about twenty-two or 2,100 are
8 actually of the police officer rank. And out of that
9 we may have about 200 plus members that are disabled,
10 long-term sick, medical leave, disability.

11 So when you start to back out those numbers
12 my actual deployable assets are much fewer than the
13 budgeted number. So if the City Council says I'm just
14 wiping out your vacancies those are potential police
15 officers that I've got forty folks, Director Watson has
16 forty people ready for hire right now that on July 1st
17 I would not be able to hire.

18 MS. SMITH: Well, I hope everything works out
19 all right. And they should be aware of that number
20 that's on disabilities which would be an inclusion into
21 it.

22 CHIEF GODBEE: Yes, ma'am.

23 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you, Ms. Smith.

24 MS. SEMMA: Hi, Julie Semma from 7-D's
25 Towing. I just want to say thank you guys for all the

1 hard work you have guys have done. But I just want one
2 clarification because last week Commander Lee indicated
3 that the rotation was supposed to change this week and
4 our letters were supposed to be in the mail yesterday.

5 CHIEF GODBEE: Logistically we just can't
6 get it done.

7 MS. SEMMA: So for sure hundred percent next
8 week?

9 CHIEF GODBEE: I made the decision today.

10 MS. SEMMA: Thank you.

11 CHIEF GODBEE: I exercised my Chief
12 prerogative. June 13th will be when we start.

13 MS. SEMMA: Thank you, sir, appreciate it.

14 MR. MOORE: Good afternoon to the Board, to
15 our Chief, Detroit's finest, and to the families that's
16 here. My name is Edward Moore. I am the liaison to
17 the Honorable Kwame Kenyatta of the Detroit City
18 Council, bringing warm greeting from his office.

19 I want to thank the hard work of the
20 Commissioners and also the Chief on the towing that we
21 now have that rotations that's been for the last five
22 year if I could think back that's the time that
23 Councilman Kenyatta has been in office that I heard so
24 many of our small companies that was crying. So
25 vigorously that you all worked so hard. I'm so happy

1 that I do hear now that there will be rotation.

2 To the Chief there, I want to thank you for
3 doing the good work you have done since you've been the
4 Chief and the quick response pertaining to the lab that
5 was necessary because that's a reflection on the
6 Department and a reflection of your good name.
7 Continue on doing a good job for us. And I also I
8 heard through the grapevine that you worked very close
9 with Detroit 300, and I want to thank you for working
10 with them because we need all soldiers, all soldiers on
11 the front line. Thank you.

12 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Moore.

13 MR. ROBERTS: How are you?

14 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Good afternoon, sir.

15 MR. ROBERTS: My name is Derrick Roberts. I
16 recently was just arrested for loud music on my way
17 home from work. And I'd just like to bring it to you
18 guys attention of how everything went down. The police
19 officers wound up getting into a high speed chase on
20 Seven Mile with two cars that didn't have anything do
21 with our situation. And, you know, I let them know
22 about my medical condition. I have a medical condition
23 which they're sending me to U of M to get checked out.
24 And the guy purposely put the cuffs on me too tight.

25 Me and Ron Scott we have pictures of

1 everything that went down. And because of this
2 situation now I can't get back and forth to school,
3 can't get back and forth to work and I work nightshift
4 and I'm totally independent. I just wanted to bring
5 that to you all attention everything that just went
6 down that night. I filed a formal complaint and so you
7 can read all the details and everything.

8 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Mr. Roberts, did you
9 file that complaint with the Office of the Chief
10 Investigator?

11 MR. ROBERTS: I filed a complaint with the
12 Precinct on Seven Mile with the supervisor, on Seven
13 Mile. I believe forwarded it to the right Commission,
14 and I was contacted by an investigator this morning.

15 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: You were. Okay. We
16 will definitely check in to that and give you a
17 response fairly quickly.

18 MR. ROBERTS: All right. Thank you.

19 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you, sir.

20 MS. HERNANDEZ: Hi, Phyllis Hernandez, Casino
21 Towing. I'm late to the meeting but I'm hearing the
22 letters won't be out now for another two or three
23 weeks, am I getting that right? No. When are the
24 letters coming out since we were told last week they
25 would be out this week?

1 CHIEF GODBEE: If you see Deputy Chief Lee he
2 will reiterated what was already said for the record.
3 We'll let you know a timeline.

4 MS. HERNANDEZ: Okay. I'm sure I'll see you
5 next week over the same thing.

6 MR. SCOTT: Ron Scott, Detroit Coalition
7 Against Police Brutality. I know this is a Committee
8 of the Whole, but Pastor, based on what we talked about
9 off the record are you in any position to discuss the
10 matter that we discussed relative to the young lady at
11 the Western District?

12 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: No, I'm not at this
13 particular time.

14 MR. SCOTT: No. Okay. We'll just leave it
15 at that as it is. But I'd just like to make a request
16 of the Chief and A.C. there, there's a matter and I
17 won't put it on the record because we had discussed
18 something else, so there's a matter that we hope we can
19 get your assistance on.

20 CHIEF GODBEE: Yes, sir. D.C. Tolbert over
21 at Western Operations, so he would be the person.

22 MR. SCOTT: Okay.

23 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Are there any other
24 comments for the Board? Any other comments for the
25 Board. Hearing and seeing none our meeting is

1 adjourned. Thank you ladies and gentlemen.
