- 3 About 3:04 p.m.
- 4 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon, ladies and
- 5 gentlemen. Welcome to the forum. Unfortunately, none
- of the Board members can make it today. One of the
- 7 members who was supposed to be here his plane is a
- 8 little late. So we're going to have a forum today.
- 9 Anyone who wants to come to the mic and give oral
- 10 communication for D.C. Lee?
- 11 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon. Bernice Smith,
- 12 Political Activist. I came today because I thought it
- 13 was very important for all of us and especially the
- 14 Commissioners, but since the Chief is here he'll relay
- 15 it, I'm sure.
- This morning there was a news bulletin not on
- 17 the TV but it was on the air because we commentators we
- 18 always listen to what each other program has to say, so
- 19 anyway. What I heard this morning was very
- 20 distressing. There was a incident and it happened on
- 21 October the 6th, but it's just now becoming public or
- 22 at least it's on the air.
- 23 What happened was there was a white SUV that
- 24 had red and blue lights flashing on the top of their
- 25 car and they stopped the car. When he pulled the car



- 1 over and he got out and it happened to be a off-duty
- 2 police officer, a woman. He ID himself -- no, first of
- 3 all, he said that he wanted to know her ID. And she
- 4 told him she was a police officer. So she asked him
- 5 where's your ID? He's saying, the lie he told because
- 6 it was a lie, that he's on a task force that's helping
- 7 the Police Department. And she said, well, where's
- 8 your ID? Well, he hesitated and said that -- she asked
- 9 him first, why did you stop me?
- So he was saying, well, you were going in and
- 11 out of the lane. So she said, where's your ID? And
- 12 that's when he told her he was the director of the
- 13 Department of Art Museum -- the library, I'm sorry, the
- 14 library. He's director of the security at the Detroit
- 15 Library.
- 16 Can you imagine somebody doing a trick like
- 17 that to a police officer? Anyway we came to the
- 18 conclusion that since she was driving a Lexus that he
- 19 probably had something else on his mind to stop her and
- 20 see who she was and her ID. So I do wish that you
- 21 would send a nice form letter with the Detroit Police
- 22 Department's Commission on it to the security, head of
- 23 security at the Detroit Library because they have no
- reason to stop no police. They don't have any
- 25 authority.



- 1 And he's taking it upon to himself to stop
- 2 this woman who was a police officer. And I think that
- 3 was outrageous, and I wouldn't let it go. And I
- 4 understand he's still on his job down there on
- 5 Woodward.
- So I thought per chance maybe I'd go in there
- 7 one day this week or maybe next week and find out who
- 8 he is and let him know what I think about it. Because
- 9 you don't do that not to the Detroit Police Officers.
- 10 That's what I wanted to let you know today especially
- 11 because I thought it was very important.
- Now, also my opinion of what has happened
- during these last three or four weeks, my opinion is
- 14 that I hope our former police chief do not go on the
- 15 air anymore and try and explain his situation. Let it
- 16 drop. And the fact that he did what he did just let it
- 17 drop. He's supposed to be getting a divorced so let
- 18 him and his personal business be his business and not
- 19 ours unless it affects the Police Department.
- Also my opinion of those women I won't even
- 21 express it here because the fact that they were out of
- 22 order. Because me being a woman myself no way in the
- 23 world would I show such display and womanhood and
- 24 disrespect not only to myself but the police
- 25 department, and my family.



- 1 A man can do only what a woman let him do.
- 2 So I do hope that this will be resolved, and we can do
- 3 something to get rid of these women. That's my
- 4 opinion. I know it's something you won't be able to do
- 5 right away, but I would put them in another area where
- 6 nobody won't even look at them anymore. That's my
- 7 comment for the day. Thank you.
- 8 Oh, and something else that came up. They're
- 9 naming of names of police chiefs, and Deputy Chief
- 10 Tolbert your name came up. And someone made a very
- 11 distasteful remark and said, no, we don't want him
- 12 because he might have a background. So if you got a
- 13 background you better tell me because I don't want to
- 14 hear it from nobody else. So anyway that's my comments
- 15 for today. Because I got trust in you. Take care.
- MR. BROWN: Anymore more communications?
- 17 Step up to the microphone and make your statement for
- 18 the record.
- 19 MR. KINLOCH: Good afternoon. My name is
- 20 Jonathan Kinloch, I'm President of the Detroit Library
- 21 Commission. The reason why I'm here today is because
- 22 of a report that was filed that made certain
- 23 allegations against one of our employees.
- I'm here to ask that this department conduct
- 25 an investigation and to get to the bottom of these



- 1 allegations. We on the Detroit Library Comission take
- 2 these charges that are stated in this police report
- 3 very serious, and I am formally requesting for this
- 4 Department to commence immediately an investigation
- 5 into what was alleged in the incident report.
- I also would like to extent on behalf of the
- 7 Detroit Public Library Commission our apologies for any
- 8 misunderstanding or any action that was most
- 9 inappropriate and may have been done that's being
- 10 alleged in this report.
- I will also like to know who I would need to
- 12 contact to follow up with this particular request that
- 13 I am placing the record?
- D.C. LEE: Okay. Deputy Chief Benjamin F.
- 15 Lee. I'm not personally aware of this particular
- 16 incident. See me after this meeting and we'll
- 17 coordinate something.
- 18 MR. ERRIGL: Good afternoon, Board, Chief.
- 19 Greg Errigl, E-R-R-I-G-L, owner of Michigan Auto
- 20 Recovery, Police Impound for the City of Detroit.
- 21 Here's what we've been watching, Chief. We're sitting
- 22 here with nothing to do. We're a impound yard for the
- 23 City of Detroit. We're aban yard for the City of
- 24 Detroit.
- We're watching the Wayne County Sheriff come



- 1 down the streets taking everything all day long all
- 2 night long. The other night four or five o'clock in
- 3 the morning they're in Southwest. The other day
- 4 they're in Northwest. We're sitting there. We haven't
- 5 have a police Halloween blitz in ten years. We're
- 6 sitting there with nothing to do. You got Wayne County
- 7 Sheriff coming in here with his company cleaning these
- 8 streets dry.
- In fact, you don't even see the Wayne County
- 10 Sheriff. You just see the trucks. They got a Carte
- 11 Blanche patrol number to pick up whatever, whatever,
- 12 whatever, so I was told.
- Now, if the City of Detroit is going to move
- 14 forward and do all kinds of these different operations
- 15 what they're going to go do whatever, they ain't going
- 16 to be nothing left for the City of Detroit to get money
- 17 paid on on administration fees or whatever on abans
- 18 because the Wayne County Sheriff's taking it all.
- 19 It's not going to the City of Detroit at all.
- 20 It should be distributed through the twenty-seven tow
- 21 yards, not though one. And the one's cleaning up
- 22 house. He's talking everything, everything. We're
- 23 sitting there just looking, and I'm just shaking my
- 24 head.
- It's not right. They're going to say Wayne



- 1 County's trumping Detroit because they're higher up
- 2 than them. That's B-S. Okay. We've never had this
- 3 problem before ever, ever, ever. Every Halloween Blitz
- 4 we always did 1,000, 2,000 cars city-wide. Okay.
- 5 We haven't had a blitz in ten years for sure.
- 6 I have three big huge gigantic impound yards, two ten
- 7 acres each, and my seven acres over there on Joy and
- 8 Southfield whatever it is building. I got 22 cars in
- 9 inventory. We use to tow thirty, forty, fifty cars a
- 10 day.
- We ain't towing one every other day if we're
- 12 lucky. We don't miss no calls either. I constantly
- double check and triple check everything. The whole
- 14 point I'm up here is I'm very disgusted. I'm very
- 15 upset, disappointed. I'm going broke. Twelve trucks.
- 16 I'm down to two trucks and they're sitting all day
- 17 long, nothing to do, watching everything going with the
- 18 Wayne County Sheriff stamp of approval.
- The City of Detroit isn't getting a penny off
- 20 it. They're cleaning our streets dry and they're going
- 21 to put twenty-seven tow yards out of business. I'm not
- 22 going to go away happy and I'm not going to go away
- 23 easy. I'm not even going away. So I don't know what
- 24 we got to do. We talked about this from before but
- 25 it's really out of hand now. Okay.



- 1 These guys truck up and down every street.
- 2 It's Wayne County Sheriff patrol number and you don't
- 3 even see not one Wayne County car there. I've never
- 4 see a Wayne County Sheriff -- three, four, five, six
- 5 time drivers from the company that's picking them up.
- It's not right. The City of Detroit ain't
- 7 getting nothing from it. You look how to scamper about
- 8 to try to make money. We try to give you money through
- 9 administration fees. We've been trying to offer you
- 10 that. They still haven't taken yet from the City of
- 11 Detroit towers. Okay. You're sitting there going like
- 12 this and everybody's taking your money. The City of
- 13 Detroit's money that needs it. Wayne County Sheriff
- 14 ain't giving you no money from these tows. They're
- 15 just not.
- Then you got the Sheriff on the news the
- 17 other day saying he's going to get all the abans, going
- down in the Wayne County neighborhood, he's going to
- 19 get the race car drivers, what have you. Well, that's
- 20 all nice and everything. What's the City of Detroit
- 21 going to get? What's the City of Detroit Towers going
- 22 to get?
- We have money invested here, too. We're all
- 24 100 percent involved in towing. We ain't doing
- 25 nothing, nothing. So I don't know who you got to talk



- 1 to to get it resolved or whatever, but we're willing
- 2 and able and ready and been ready to tow and to work
- 3 and to do whatever. We can't do it if you got one
- 4 company cleaning the streets and the Wayne County
- 5 Sheriff program. Just can't. There's nothing there,
- 6 nothing, so.
- 7 And I don't know where Mr. Duperry comes up
- 8 with all these fictitious figures he gets because
- 9 whatever figures he's got you might as well cut by
- 10 75 percent minus another 30 percent and you're going to
- 11 have two percent if you're lucky. Which means the City
- of Detroit is still going to get nothing, so.
- You be watching everyday, Wayne County
- 14 Sheriff, doing the blind pigs, doing the drag racing,
- doing the abandon cars, up and down the street.
- 16 There's nobody there but one tow company under Wayne
- 17 County Sheriff Act.
- 18 So hopefully we can get something resolved.
- 19 I don't know. I'm expressing my opinion to the Board
- 20 here and to the Chief and to the Deputy Chief and
- 21 whatever, and hopefully maybe something can come about
- 22 it because if the Wayne County Sheriff's going to take
- 23 care of the streets why don't you just tell the Detroit
- 24 Police Department to go home. And I know we don't want
- 25 to do that. I don't want to see that. I don't want to



- 1 do that. Detroit Police Department -- Wayne County
- 2 Sheriff do it. I thought Wayne County Sheriff was
- 3 jailers and takes care of the courts. All of a sudden
- 4 they're on the streets, too, now?
- 5 Chief, see what you can do? Because doing
- 6 one car the other day and I got all these contracts and
- 7 we got nothing going, nothing, nothing.
- D.C. LEE: Just a comment. The Wayne County
- 9 Sheriffs do have jurisdiction over all Wayne County, so
- 10 we can't control what they do in the streets of Detroit
- in terms of the abandon vehicles. If they come in and
- 12 they find them and they ordered them to be towed, they
- 13 have to be towed.
- And I don't know how much of an effort we're
- doing in terms of aban vehicles. I think we still do
- 16 have the aban officers at the various precincts. I
- don't know what your contact is with those officers,
- 18 but I do believe they're still tagging cars. There's
- 19 some. How many are out there? I don't know.
- 20 MR. ERRIGL: There was a lot of out there.
- 21 Like today we go down the street there's nothing there.
- 22 There were cars there, but during the night and the
- 23 morning and the morning preceding, what have you, what
- 24 have you, every day they're gone. They'll find some
- 25 way how to pick up one of these cars in the street



- 1 whether it be a car parked four foot from the curb or
- 2 expired plate or a flat tire or dirt on the window or
- 3 leaves on the -- or whatever. But they're looking for
- 4 every excuse and they're getting every excuse and
- 5 they're using every excuse possible to do it, so.
- But we're sitting here doing nothing and our
- 7 taxes are due out here pretty soon and we make our
- 8 money paying taxes by the cars we tow off our streets,
- 9 so. All right. Thank you, sir.
- MR. BROWN: Any more oral communications?
- MR. STIDHAM: Good afternoon, Mr. Brown, good
- 12 afternoon, Chief, Deputy Chief. Tom Stidham. Chief, I
- 13 just wanted to ask if, I know that the City is
- 14 conducting an RFP and that process is working for a
- 15 software vendor related to logistics management, but I
- 16 just wanted to see if you could outline, Deputy Chief
- 17 Tolbert, could outline any initiatives with respect to
- 18 towing that the Department is attempting to implement
- or changes that are supposed to be made?
- D.C. LEE: I'm not personally aware. If
- 21 Deputy Chief Tolbert wants to take the podium he can
- 22 address whether or not he knows of any initiatives.
- MR. STIDHAM: Great. Thank you.
- D.C. TOLBERT: Deputy Chief James Tolbert,
- 25 for the record. There was a meeting this week, and I



- 1 was not able to attend the meeting so I'll get a
- 2 briefing on that meeting and maybe I can have some more
- 3 information next week.
- 4 D.C. LEE: Thank you.
- 5 MR. STIDHAM: Chief, before you leave, can I
- 6 ask who the meeting was with?
- 7 D.C. TOLBERT: I wasn't there, so I don't
- 8 know exactly, but there was a meeting this week and I
- 9 haven't --
- 10 MR. STIDHAM: Interdepartmental or other
- 11 agencies?
- 12 D.C. TOLBERT: I don't know who was there. I
- 13 honestly don't. I just know there was a meeting
- 14 because I had someone from my office there and I
- 15 haven't been briefed as to who was at the meeting.
- 16 MR. STIDHAM: Can you tell us the subject of
- 17 the meeting?
- D.C. TOLBERT: Something to do with towing,
- 19 yes.
- MR. STIDHAM: Okay. Thank you.
- MR. BROWN: Are there anymore oral
- 22 communications? Hearing none, this forum is adjourned.
- 23 Thank you.
- 24 (The hearing concluded at 3:19 p.m.)
