4 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ladies  
5 and gentlemen. How is everybody doing this afternoon?

6 AUDIENCE: Good.

7 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Welcome to the Board  
8 of Police Commissioners Meeting. My name is Jerome  
9 Warfield, Chairman of the Board of Police  
10 Commissioners.

11 Serving with me today is Commissioner Donnell  
12 White. We also have, representing the Chief's Office,  
13 Assistant Chief White. Good to have you.

14 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Thank you.

15 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: And sitting at the  
16 table also is the Board Secretary, Mr. George Anthony.

17 I am going to ask right now if Mr. Anthony  
18 can introduce for you all the rest of our staff that's  
19 here and present today.

20 EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you,  
21 Mr. Chair. For the record, George Anthony, Secretary  
22 to the Board.

23 We have present Ms. Pamela Davis Drake, our  
24 Chief Investigator; Ms. Lolitha Porter Coleman, our  
25 Director of Police Personnel; Attorney Celia Banks

1 Washington, who is the Attorney to the Board. We also  
2 have Mr. Robert Brown, our office manager; Officer Dan  
3 Donakowski, who is recording our proceedings, and new  
4 to our meetings is Ms. Rhonda Foster from Hanson Court  
5 Reporting Service.

6 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you,  
7 Mr. Anthony.

8 At this time, I am going to ask that  
9 Commissioner White would give us our invocation for  
10 today's meeting, please.

11 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Heavenly Father, we just  
12 ask that you be a hedge of protection around the men  
13 and women who have been called to serve this great  
14 Department. We ask that you bless this meeting and all  
15 those who are present. Bless those who have been  
16 called to serve in this capacity. Bless those citizens  
17 who go over and beyond their call of duty to be a part  
18 of the solution. May we all come together on one  
19 accord to serve your kingdom here on earth. We ask  
20 these things in your name. Amen.

21 AUDIENCE: Amen.

22 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you,  
23 Commissioner.

24 At this time, we are moving to standing  
25 committee reports.

1 Well, first of all, any presentation from the  
2 Chief's office or any comments?

3 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: No, sir. I am happy  
4 to be here. Good afternoon, everybody. It's a  
5 negative report from the Chief's office.

6 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Okay. Thank you, sir.  
7 Mr. Anthony, anything?

8 EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ANTHONY: No, sir.  
9 Nothing.

10 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Okay. Ms. Washington,  
11 do you have something for us, ma'am?

12 ATTORNEY WASHINGTON: Thank you, Mr. Chair. Celia  
13 Washington, attorney for the Board.

14 There is a matter, a trial board -- trial  
15 board appeal matter that we have actually resolved, but  
16 we do need to put on the record the charges, unless  
17 there is an objection to that.

18 Attorney Stolberg?

19 MR. STOLBERG: No objection.

20 ATTORNEY WASHINGTON: And Commander Serda?

21 COMMANDER SERDA: Yes, no objection.

22 ATTORNEY WASHINGTON: This is in the disciplinary  
23 appeal of Police Officer Shamar Woods, BPC number  
24 12-002D, disciplinary number 110566, as it would relate  
25 to Police Officer Shamar Woods, Badge 737. There were

1 two counts.

2 Count one, divulging official confidential  
3 information to anyone except the person for whom it is  
4 intended or as directed by the commanding officer, or  
5 under due process of law.

6 Count two, ignorance of rules or orders.

7 There was a trial board convened on June 21,  
8 2012, to hear the charges filed against Officer Woods.  
9 At that trial board hearing, the Department advocate  
10 was Commander Jeff Romeo. Attorney Don Stolberg  
11 represented Officer Woods.

12 In that decision, of the same day, June 21,  
13 2012, the trial board accepted Officer Woods' guilty  
14 plea as to both charges and specifications.

15 As a result, the trial board recommended a  
16 penalty of a 25-day suspension for charge 1. And a  
17 5-day suspension for charge 2, without pay and  
18 benefits, to be served consecutively. So that was for  
19 a total of 30 days.

20 That recommendation was adopted by the Chief  
21 of Police August 2nd, 2012. The petitioner brought  
22 forth an appeal under Article 9.

23 What we have been able to do with the  
24 assistance of attorney Stolberg and Commander Serda, we  
25 have been able to reach a settlement or a resolution.

1                   The Petitioner had proposed a 10-day  
2                   suspension. And, of course, as I said, the trial board  
3                   found a 30-day. We were able to arrive at a midpoint  
4                   of a 20-day suspension. And all parties are satisfied  
5                   with that.

6                   CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Okay. Any questions  
7                   for counsel?

8                   COMMISSIONER WHITE: I have none.

9                   CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, ma'am, for  
10                  the report. Appreciate it.

11                  You may want to stay there, please, ma'am.  
12                  Because we do have a suspension without pay matter that  
13                  we took up last week, and Commissioner White was not  
14                  here, so we wanted to get his weigh in on that  
15                  particular item, in order that it may go one way or the  
16                  other.

17                  Sir, Mr. Anthony?

18                  EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ANTHONY: Mr. Chair, last  
19                  week the Board considered the suspension without pay  
20                  recommendation from the Chief, regarding Police Officer  
21                  Tiniki Gibbs. And unless contravened by Commissioner  
22                  White, the suspension without pay recommendation was  
23                  had.

24                  CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Hearing or seeing no  
25                  contravention, that suspension without pay will stand.

1 ATTORNEY WASHINGTON: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

2 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, ma'am.

3 There is no new business or old business.

4 Our next meeting will be held Thursday,  
5 March the 14th, 2013, at 6:30 p.m., in the Central  
6 District at the Boy Scouts of America. That's located  
7 at 1776 West Warren, here in Detroit, Michigan.

8 At this time, we will open up the floor for  
9 oral communications. If you wish to address the Board  
10 of Police Commissioners, we ask that you come to the  
11 podium in the center, that you state for the record  
12 your first and last name. And spell it for our  
13 recorder. And we ask that you would abide by our  
14 two-minute time limit so that we can hear from as many  
15 people as possible.

16 You may come at this time to the podium.

17 KATRICE ROBINSON: Good afternoon.

18 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ma'am.

19 KATRICE ROBINSON: I am Katrice,  
20 K-a-t-r-i-c-e, Robinson. I am President of Midwest  
21 Civic Council Block Club. And on behalf of them, I  
22 would like to know -- we are still trying to pursue a  
23 mini station, which we already have the location, but  
24 we are trying to at least secure an officer for that  
25 location. And I understand that you do have some



1 people that are being not promoted, but they have  
2 graduated from the Academy. No? Is that incorrect?

3 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: I don't think so. But  
4 keep -- go ahead. Ask your question. I am sorry.

5 KATRICE ROBINSON: Well, we would like to  
6 have an officer assigned to that location. And we do  
7 have some businesses that are forthcoming to put up \$50  
8 a week to assist in any services that you may need to  
9 put a policeman station or an officer at that location.

10 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Okay. Thank you,  
11 Mrs. Robinson.

12 Assistant Chief?

13 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Yes, through the  
14 Chair, D.C. Turner, can you take care of that?

15 DEPUTY CHIEF TURNER: D.C. Melvin Turner,  
16 Police Community Services. I will take care of this.  
17 I will give her a card. I handle the mini stations,  
18 so...

19 KATRICE ROBINSON: Awesome. Thank you.

20 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you.

21 Mrs. Robinson, please make sure you talk to  
22 Deputy Chief Turner after the meeting.

23 KATRICE ROBINSON: I will. Thank you.

24 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, ma'am.

25 Good to see you.

1 Next?

2 GREGORY ERRIGO: Good evening, Chief, Board.

3 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good evening, sir.

4 GREGORY ERRIGO: Gregory Errigo, E-r-r-i-g-o,  
5 Michigan Auto Recovery.

6 The reason why I am here today, a couple  
7 things. Number one, when the City of Detroit got --  
8 wanted to get into the scrap business or whatever,  
9 taking our scrap, they said we were going to get paid  
10 in 30 days. Then they said 60 days. At any rate, I  
11 guess I've been doing it now for four months, just  
12 about. Still haven't got a check yet. That's number  
13 one.

14 And number two, I have -- due to the fact you  
15 guys are in -- the City of Detroit is in the ABAN  
16 business now, I have 18 abandoned boats sitting at the  
17 property there, been there 10 years. I have all the  
18 paperwork on them, I have the MC numbers on them. And  
19 I want to get permission to bring them down, at \$75 a  
20 boat, to number one pound so you can process them.  
21 Because we got them from the streets of the City of  
22 Detroit, under our ABAN license. And they took all our  
23 ABANs away, and I can't do nothing with them. So I  
24 want to deliver them down to number one pound. If  
25 permission is granted, it is \$75 a boat, so you guys

1 can process them and do whatever.

2 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Errigo.  
3 Assistant Chief?

4 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Through the Chair, I  
5 am going to have to do some research on that.

6 Actually, Deputy Chief Ewing and I met on  
7 this issue recently or discussed this issue. I won't  
8 say we met. And there are a lot of unanswered  
9 questions that I have about this new process. So I  
10 don't want to, you know, go on record as saying you can  
11 take your boats down to the new pound just yet. I am  
12 not familiar with exactly how the process is going to  
13 go. So if you can give me some time to follow-up, I  
14 will look into it and get back to you.

15 THE WITNESS: Absolutely. I appreciate it.

16 I also got a ticket for them from the City of  
17 Detroit for having them there. And they asked me, the  
18 gentleman from the City who gave me the ticket, and my  
19 attorney is handling this ticket now, he asked me  
20 what's the deal with all these boats? I said, these  
21 are abandoned boats given to us by the Police  
22 Department. He says, well, you have to do something  
23 with them. So I would appreciate if I can get an  
24 answer back, Chief, or whatever. Pleasure. Just  
25 welcome your phone call.

1 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: No problem. I am  
2 digesting a lot of data right now, getting a lot of  
3 information and learning a lot about these new  
4 processes that are in place. So give me a couple days.  
5 I will get back to you.

6 GREGORY ERRIGO: If I can be of assistance to  
7 you and answer a lot of your questions, I am sure that  
8 we can have an enlightening sit-down and put you in the  
9 direction hopefully to be in.

10 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Thank you. I may  
11 reach out to you. Thank you.

12 GREGORY ERRIGO: Thank you, sir.

13 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Errigo.  
14 Are there others?

15 BERNICE SMITH: Good afternoon to the  
16 Commissioner. Bernice Smith, political activist, and  
17 to you, young man, the Chief, good to have you here  
18 with us.

19 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Thank you.

20 BERNICE SMITH: I was looking forward to the  
21 present Chief because I did have a message for him.

22 In the meantime, this morning on our radio  
23 program, we had Nolan Finley was one of the speakers.  
24 And he made the most outrageous suggestion that we  
25 get -- or the people of Detroit would recommend or

1 suggest that Gary Brown be our Police Chief.

2 Well, you know naturally, I had to call in  
3 and give my opinion on what I thought about Gary Brown  
4 and his background. So I don't think you need to be  
5 worried too much about too many people support him as a  
6 Police Chief, but this is what's going on.

7 Now, I have no complaints about what the  
8 police are doing because of the fact that you were  
9 dismantled on the 4th, I understand; is that correct?  
10 The gang squad and the technical squad?

11 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Assistant Chief?

12 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Through the Chair,  
13 the transfers did, in fact, go through, with regards to  
14 gang squad.

15 BERNICE SMITH: Don't you think that due to  
16 the fact that we are having an election, and I  
17 understand that it was the Mayor and the Police Chief  
18 that made these suggestions about disbanding -- okay.  
19 You don't have to answer that. I know. But I think it  
20 is just horrible because I think that the people are  
21 really crying out for the protection, and especially  
22 the students, because we have heard them here  
23 constantly and at the various meetings that we have  
24 inside of 1300 and in the schools. So I feel as though  
25 that they are really important in our lives. And I

1 don't understand why the Mayor or the Chief would even  
2 think of trying to disband those vital entities as far  
3 as the police is concerned. But I am going to fight  
4 with them as far as that's concerned.

5 Now, Mr. Warfield, one last thing. You did a  
6 marvelous job last meeting. I was not here, but I  
7 heard about it. And you, White, went along with the  
8 suggestions, so keep up the good work because we are  
9 going to need you after this election because more  
10 people are coming on board, and I do hope that you will  
11 remain as Commissioners on the Board because we are  
12 going to need you, especially me when I get on there.

13 But I thank you so much. Keep up the good  
14 work.

15 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Mother Smith, may I  
16 ask you one question just for clarity?

17 BERNICE SMITH: Yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: You had referenced the  
19 students that came and spoke at this meeting, and you  
20 certainly attend most of our meetings.

21 BERNICE SMITH: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Do you recall just  
23 approximately how many students? Do you think it was  
24 one or two? Or do you think it was quite a few more  
25 students that spoke up at our meetings than just two?

1                   BERNICE SMITH: It was over 10. 10 to 15, at  
2 one particular meeting that we had up here. And then  
3 they were outside picketing later on after we -- that  
4 was week before last.

5                   CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: So you would say it  
6 was several?

7                   BERNICE SMITH: Yes, definitely. And at the  
8 school also.

9                   CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Oh, okay.

10                  BERNICE SMITH: Are they going to make an  
11 issue that it wasn't enough?

12                  CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: No, I just wanted to  
13 be clear.

14                  BERNICE SMITH: Oh, all right. It was on the  
15 record that it was over 15 students in this room  
16 two weeks ago.

17                  CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Thank you, ma'am.

18                  BERNICE SMITH: You're welcome.

19                  CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Are there others who  
20 wish to address the Board of Police Commissioners?

21                  DEPUTY CHIEF TURNER: D.C. Turner. I just  
22 want to remind everyone at 6:00 today, at the UAW Hall,  
23 we have a graduation for our Reserves, and the public  
24 is invited. It is on Henry Street south of Jefferson  
25 at the UAW Hall.

1 EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ANTHONY: 6:00 or 7:00?

2 DEPUTY CHIEF TURNER: 6:00 p.m.

3 EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ANTHONY: Okay. Thank  
4 you, sir.

5 SHARON PANSELL: Good afternoon, Board.

6 Sharon Pannell. I just wanted to say thank you to all  
7 the police that helped the officer over at 2nd precinct  
8 out, Officer Eric Ewing, I think that was his name, he  
9 had a fire in his home, his wife has cancer, and he was  
10 out of money. And he was wasn't even eating his own  
11 meals until his family ate. And the police stepped up.  
12 And I thought that was really nice.

13 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Absolutely. Thank  
14 you, Ms. Pannell.

15 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Thank you.

16 TOM STIDHAM: Good morning, Mr. Chair.

17 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good afternoon.

18 TOM STIDHAM: Tom Stidham.

19 I just wanted to ask. I know that previously  
20 the Department has said it was implementing its towing  
21 changes in phases. And Assistant Chief, I just  
22 wondered if you could give us some glimpse into what is  
23 the next phase and the timetable for the implementation  
24 of that.

25 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: As I indicated



1 earlier, through the Chair, I am not at this time in a  
2 position to give you a timeline. I really am in the  
3 beginning stages of understanding this new process.  
4 And I have got some questions myself that I will have  
5 to meet with the Chief and get some answers on as  
6 relates to the direction of the new towing practice.

7 I apologize. I just don't have the  
8 information or am not in a position to answer your  
9 question today. I just don't have enough information  
10 to give you a solid answer.

11 TOM STIDHAM: I am not just talking about the  
12 process with respect to abandoned vehicles and the  
13 treatment of it, but also I know after the abandoned  
14 vehicles, there is supposed to be some new programs or  
15 phases coming into effect. And so I understand you  
16 can't give me an idea about the time, or a timeline.  
17 But I just wonder if you can just talk generally about  
18 the next phase.

19 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Well, if I spoke  
20 generally, I would be speculating. I have heard what  
21 you have heard, that there's supposed to be a protocol  
22 in place, a strategic plan. But I have heard it from  
23 many different sources. I have not seen anything in  
24 writing. And I think it will be improper for me to  
25 really speculate on exactly what the strategy is going

1 to be, without reading it for myself and seeing the  
2 appropriate signatures affixed to it, so --

3 TOM STIDHAM: I can appreciate that. Can you  
4 give us an idea, though, of how much revenue the new --  
5 at least from the ABAN side, is generated for the City?

6 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Well, I certainly  
7 can't talk numbers. And again, you know, I hate giving  
8 you this bland answer, but until I see a document with  
9 the right signatures affixed to it, you know, I can't  
10 really speak with any degree of intellect as to what  
11 the Department's position is going to be going forward.  
12 I have heard much of what you have heard. I have heard  
13 the rumors. I have even read some things that were  
14 written, various locations, but I have not seen  
15 anything from the Department or from the Mayor's Office  
16 with regards to this new process.

17 TOM STIDHAM: Okay. And lastly, if you  
18 indulge me one more question, with respect to the  
19 municipal parking, I know they are I believe assuming a  
20 function of the whole process, is who is the interface  
21 or the person that -- from towers we can at least reach  
22 out to contact to get some additional information?

23 ASSISTANT CHIEF WHITE: Well, at this point  
24 it might be me. And that's one of the discussions that  
25 I am having. You know, you can take my name and number

1 and give me a call, but right now, that's all the  
2 information that I have.

3 TOM STIDHAM: Very well. Thank you, sir.  
4 Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

5 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Can you stay there one  
6 second, Mr. Stidham, please.

7 First of all, thank you for all the good  
8 inquiries.

9 I just want to remind certainly the  
10 Department and the citizens that this Board is already  
11 on record saying that we believe that the abandoned  
12 vehicle plan that is in place is illegal, because it  
13 violates the City tow rules, which the Mayor himself  
14 has signed off on, and the former Chief of Police have  
15 signed off on.

16 And according to the Detroit City Charter, in  
17 order for new rules and new processes to take place as  
18 relates to towing, it should come through this body.  
19 And so any rules, procedures, new practices of towing  
20 that do not come through this body according to the  
21 Detroit City Charter, and until that goes away, we are  
22 still under, and so I just want to just put that out  
23 there for the record, that any plans to come through  
24 really needs to come through this Board, through the  
25 process that we did I think so successfully with

1 everybody being on board with it, meaning members from  
2 the towing community, from the Council's Office, from  
3 law office, from the Clerk's office, I mean everyone  
4 who needed to be in that process was there. You know,  
5 personally, just as a member, not as a Chair, but just  
6 as a member of the Board, I take exception to the fact  
7 that there are plans being devised to come up with a  
8 new towing procedure and it is not coming through the  
9 proper channels.

10 Thank you, sir.

11 TOM STIDHAM: Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Are there others?

13 RON SCOTT: Okay. Good afternoon.

14 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good afternoon,  
15 Mr. Scott.

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Name, for the  
17 reporter.

18 RON SCOTT: Ron Scott. With the prospect  
19 looming of an emergency manager, emergency financial  
20 manager, I know you may have discussed this before, the  
21 question looms in relationship to the Board and the  
22 Charter, as to the way it fits. The way I read it, I  
23 read it that this body should stand. That it was  
24 created sort of in 1974, and subsequently validated via  
25 impose and others that it should still exist. But if

1 it does not exist, I would like to suggest that this  
2 body go on record, in addition to whatever litigation  
3 might proceed in relationship to appeal, that this body  
4 go on record as stated, that public safety in this area  
5 of the state of Michigan is part of the sovereignty, is  
6 one of the principle elements of the U.S. Constitution,  
7 and that it should have oversight of the people. And I  
8 think this body should make a statement to that effect.  
9 And that it should join with us and others in this  
10 community who have been coming to these meetings for a  
11 long period of time, that I have great disdain for  
12 anyone who would take away the options that we have in  
13 terms of determining our level of public safety and how  
14 it is rendered at this particular point.

15 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Are there others?

16 ANNA ROMANO: Good afternoon.

17 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Good afternoon.

18 ANNA ROMANO: Anna Romano.

19 Commissioner Warfield, you had asked  
20 regarding how many students who were here the other  
21 day. There were 20 students, and the petitions I think  
22 they turned in had approximately 400 signatures that  
23 they had collected in the community.

24 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Yes, ma'am.

25 ANNA ROMANO: So I know that you had asked.

1 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Somebody needed to  
2 know that number because I think a misrepresentation  
3 was put out there. Thank you.

4 ANNA ROMANO: Thank you.

5 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Appreciate that.

6 BERNICE SMITH: If they come to the meetings,  
7 they will know.

8 CHAIRPERSON WARFIELD: Any there others? Are  
9 there others?

10 Hearing and seeing no others -- are there  
11 others? Hearing and seeing no others, we will close  
12 that section of our meeting.

13 I will do my report right now. I just want  
14 to thank the men and women of the City of Detroit.  
15 Certainly we are in challenging times but we are up for  
16 the challenge. And we thank you just for your  
17 tenacity. And we thank you for hanging in there and  
18 staying in there during these changes.

19 Again, I want to say thank to you all of our  
20 officers.

21 I do have one of our staff persons is working  
22 on a special project for our officers, and he is  
23 reaching out to who commands now, and because we want  
24 to help those officers who are struggling who are in  
25 trouble financially as best as we can. And so when you

1 get a call from our office, it is because we want to  
2 help, and we want to try and see if we can do some  
3 things on a major level, on a major scale, that will  
4 help those officers who are living -- especially living  
5 here in the City of Detroit. And so just know that  
6 this Board cares deeply about the public safety of the  
7 City. We pray daily, especially now, that our young  
8 people are safe in their schools, going to and coming  
9 from schools. And that, you know, and that literally  
10 there is a hedge of protection around this City.

11 So we thank you for your support. And we  
12 thank you for coming out.

13 At this time, that will end our meeting  
14 there. Unfortunately, we do not have a quorum today.  
15 So we will end the meeting as a whole.

16 Thank you, ladies and gentlemen. We will see  
17 you next week at the Boy Scouts on Warren. Thank you.  
18 Bye, bye.
