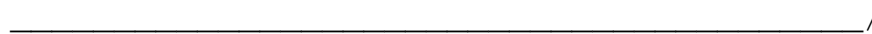

CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Good afternoon and welcome to the Board of Police Commissioners meeting. My name is Jessica Taylor, Commissioner Jessica Taylor. And joining me is vice chair, Commissioner Donnell White. We are still waiting for Commissioner Warfield. And also joining us is the Chief himself, James Craig.

CHIEF CRAIG: How you all doing?

CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: George, would you introduce the rest of our staff, please?

SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, Madame Chair. For the record, George Anthony, secretary to the Board. The staff includes Miss Pamela Davis-Drake, our chief investigator seated in the front. We also have representing the police personnel bureau, Inspector Lashinda Houser seated in front. Our office manager is Mr. Robert Brown to my right. Miss Wendy Boer is from Hanson Court Reporting Services, and she is recording our proceedings. And Officer Kent Cooper is in the back recording electronically. That completes the introductions.

CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: At this time, is the Chaplain here, Chaplain Penson?

1           CHAPLAIN PENSON: May we all bow our heads in  
2 a word of prayer? Oh gracious, kind and wonderful  
3 heavenly father, we come before you first and foremost  
4 to say thank you. Now we ask your blessings upon this  
5 meeting, God. We ask that you bless this Board, bless  
6 this Department, God, because we know we are living in a  
7 world that is forever changing, God. But we know, God,  
8 that you will bless us with the resources that we would  
9 measure with the time. So we ask your blessings upon us  
10 once again. In Jesus' name, amen.

11           CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: We can't approve anything  
12 today. We don't have a quorum. So, we are going to  
13 move to the Chief's report.

14           CHIEF CRAIG: Okay. I'd like to -- if anybody  
15 has any questions, I just want to talk about  
16 year-to-date crime. Year-to-date crime, overall,  
17 violent crime is down 6 percent. As it relates to  
18 homicide, we are sitting at a 7 percent reduction in  
19 homicide. Property crime, we are down roughly 3  
20 percent. Correction, 2 percent. And property crime or  
21 property crime is down 3 percent, which is good news.

22           In terms of specific incidents, one of the  
23 areas that we struggled with over the last month or so  
24 had been shooting incidents. However, we had reduced  
25 the number, and we are now sitting just slightly at

1 above 3 percent. That concludes my remarks on crime.  
2 And I certainly will take any questions that are asked.

3 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Okay. Are there any  
4 questions?

5 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Chief, I'm sorry. On the  
6 part with the shootings, is that part of the part one  
7 that you were saying were up or down 3 percent?

8 CHIEF CRAIG: We are up on shooting incidents,  
9 we are up slightly, just above 3 percent.

10 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Is that part one crime?

11 CHIEF CRAIG: No, that's shootings. Part one  
12 crime is defined as violent and property crime. And we  
13 are actually down almost 3-1/2 percent.

14 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Okay. Thank you, Madame  
15 Chair.

16 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Okay. Since there is no  
17 other questions, we can do announcements. We have our  
18 Thursday, September 12th, at 6:30 p.m., we will have our  
19 community meeting at the Central District, Boy Scouts of  
20 America at 1776 West Warren. Again, that's Thursday,  
21 September 12, at the Central District.

22 At this time, we will ask for oral  
23 communications from the audience.

24 MS. PANNELL: Good afternoon, Sharon Pannell.  
25 I was just wondering about the HEAT program. And my

1 Second Precinct meeting is this Tuesday coming at 7:00.  
2 And I was wondering if you could have somebody either  
3 over there for some literature or --

4 CHIEF CRAIG: Yes. In fact, if we can make  
5 sure that the Second Precinct commander -- and you want  
6 to know information about HEAT?

7 MS. PANNELL: Yes, the pamphlets and stuff  
8 they pass out on the east side, if I could have some  
9 ready for us so we can pass them out on the west side.

10 CHIEF CRAIG: Absolutely. Okay.

11 MS. PANNELL: Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Any other communications?

13 MR. WALID: Good afternoon. My name is Dawud  
14 Walid. I'm a resident of Detroit. I'm also the  
15 executive director of the Michigan chapter of CAIR, the  
16 Council on American-Islamic Relations, a civil liberties  
17 organization. A couple of my constituents had  
18 complained at Mohamed's Mosque off of Wyoming, 14880  
19 Wyoming, that there were two teens, one 13 years old,  
20 one 17, were talking and they were stopped and  
21 questioned by the police and frisked. One of them was  
22 frisked until some of the brothers outside of the mosque  
23 came and asked the police officers what they were doing.  
24 And then the whole incident basically desisted at that  
25 point, in which we will be writing a formal complaint.

1                   But I bring this up in terms of as a civil  
2 rights activist and working with other clergy members  
3 and civil rights organizations, you know, there are  
4 concerns that what went out in the media about the so  
5 called Stop and Frisk that was going on in New York,  
6 that might be brought here. And I think that it would  
7 be useful for the trust between the community and law  
8 enforcement that the logistics and perhaps the training  
9 information that the Manhattan Institute is working with  
10 the Detroit Police Department, if that could go ahead  
11 and be released, I know the ACLU put in a FOIA request  
12 for that information last week. I think that for the  
13 public trust, it would be best, Chief, if you could go  
14 ahead and release this information so that we as  
15 citizens can be assured --

16                   MS. TAYLOR: Can you just refer the  
17 information to the Board?

18                   MR. WALID: We can be assured that this  
19 Manhattan Institute that helped institute Stop and Frisk  
20 in New York, that they are not doing similar training or  
21 logistics under the name of so called search and  
22 seizure. Thank you.

23                   CHIEF CRAIG: Thank you for your comments, and  
24 I will respond, Madame Chair. First and foremost, the  
25 Detroit Police Department has not and will not adopt a

1 Stop and Frisk model that you have read about in  
2 New York. Certainly, if there's any complaints or  
3 individuals have felt that their rights have been  
4 infringed upon, we have a complaint process. And  
5 certainly, if you would care to, certainly you can go to  
6 the Office of the Chief Investigator or certainly bring  
7 that matter to the attention of us and we'll have our  
8 internal affairs investigate it.

9 You can leave your name and number, and we  
10 will have someone contact you before you leave. But in  
11 terms of Stop and Frisk, I don't even like to use Stop  
12 and Frisk because it has such a negative connotation.  
13 But what I do -- I'd like to refer to it as  
14 investigative stops. And certainly, not all  
15 investigative stops result in a search or a frisk. They  
16 just don't. Sometimes police officers make  
17 investigative stops. It could be a traffic stop.  
18 There's no frisk. But if there's reasonable suspicion  
19 that a pat down or frisk should be made, the officers  
20 articulate that.

21 We are under a Consent Judgment. And because  
22 of that, part of our Consent Judgment strictly deals  
23 with that area. I or no one else will change that. We  
24 are under Consent Judgment. So, I understand that the  
25 Manhattan Institute made some reference to Stop and



1 Frisk. I should just advise you that Manhattan  
2 Institute or the Bratton Group or any of the other  
3 consultants working with the Detroit Police Department  
4 are just that, consultants. They advise. They make  
5 recommendations.

6 There has been no new training program  
7 instituted in the Detroit Police Department in reference  
8 to a Stop and Frisk model used by New York. That has  
9 not happened. It will not happen. And we have not  
10 changed our policy.

11 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: I'm going to also ask,  
12 Mr. Walid, if you would talk to our chief investigator.

13 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Madame Chair, I just want  
14 to also go on the record, it's been a couple weeks that  
15 we have talked about the need for a community  
16 information surrounding this specific issue. There was  
17 some discussion about possibly using our September 12  
18 date. And so as a recommendation, that possibly we  
19 could be in a position to share information with the  
20 community and encourage particularly individuals like  
21 brother Dawud Walid and other community representatives  
22 who have the burden of sharing information throughout  
23 the community, to come and be a part of a healthy  
24 discussion to help disseminate some of the myths that  
25 may be out there.

1 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: George, have we  
2 officially set that date?

3 SECRETARY ANTHONY: For next week we can.

4 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: For the community  
5 meeting?

6 CHIEF CRAIG: I just want to also add that on  
7 the 24th, it's the community command accountability  
8 meeting that we have a CAN meeting. That meeting's sole  
9 focus will be on Stop and Frisk. And we are preparing  
10 and completing an executive summary that certainly will  
11 explain some of the misunderstanding. But, in fact, the  
12 police department is adopting some of the language  
13 that's consistent with the judge's ruling in New York.  
14 I think his name is Shines. But at that meeting, that  
15 meeting will be a public meeting. And we will be able  
16 to articulate through our Executive Summary and during  
17 that session any issues surrounding Stop and Frisk.

18 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Chief, what time is that  
19 meeting for the record?

20 CHIEF CRAIG: 10:00 a.m.

21 MS. PANNELL: Where?

22 CHIEF CRAIG: It will be conducted here.

23 MR. WELBORNE: Good afternoon. My name is  
24 Bill Welborne, president of City Wide. I'm here to --  
25 I'm trying to get a program started. Now, maybe it will

1 help and maybe not. I'm not sure. Since City Wide is  
2 supposed to give all the information to the precincts,  
3 I'm going to start a website that's going to have each  
4 -- each president will have access to, where everybody  
5 will have access to because lot of times things come up  
6 after my meeting is over, and it's a whole month before  
7 we can get back to these people again to get them  
8 information. And I can't make enough phone calls and  
9 things like that.

10 So, what I would like to do, Chief, if you --  
11 I know we got a meeting. We supposed to have a meeting  
12 scheduled for next month, some time next month. I  
13 talked to Sergeant Carey and Lieutenant -- what's his  
14 name?

15 CHIEF CRAIG: Roche.

16 MR. WELBORNE: Roche, that's right. I  
17 can't think of his name. But we are going to get  
18 together, and we are going to work on some information  
19 for you so you will be ready for us when we come down.

20 CHIEF CRAIG: Okay. I will look forward to  
21 it.

22 MR. WELBORNE: But I want to start this City  
23 Wide website, everybody, where we can put all the  
24 information on there so people can read this. And  
25 people who don't have access to a PC, I will find some

1 other way to deal with this. But I talked to Eastern  
2 District last night, that meeting. And they thought it  
3 was a pretty good idea because I had lot of problems  
4 over there. And I finally got things straightened out  
5 over there. So, I just wanted to let you know about  
6 that.

7 CHIEF CRAIG: Thank you.

8 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Are there any more  
9 comments? Are there any more comments? Okay. I just  
10 want to restate, the community meeting for  
11 September 12th at the Central District. We will have it  
12 on the 12th at the Central District so you be aware of  
13 that. Are there any more? Yes. The date for the  
14 public hearing at the Central District, George is  
15 reminding me, it's the public hearing at the Central  
16 District for September 12th. And we talked about having  
17 a meeting for the public. So, that will be that meeting  
18 at 6:30 at the Boy Scouts of America. It's at 1776 West  
19 Warren.

20 Well, if there's no other comments, we move  
21 for adjournment. We don't have a quorum. Adjourned.
