



**EM Given the Boot?** 



On September 25, 2014, the City Council passed a resolution authorizing the dismissal of Emergency Manager Kevyn Orr and ending receivership in the City of Detroit effective immediately with the effective date of the plan of adjustment. The

resolution restores power to the Mayor and Council even though Kevyn Orr was kept in place to continue with the bankruptcy proceedings. The vote was unanimous and begins a new chapter in Detroit's history. Councilwoman Sheffield preferred to restore complete democracy immediately but like her colleagues realized exit from bankruptcy was priority for a host of reasons.

#### **Blind-Sided!**



To the dismay of Council and countless residents, the Emergency Manager, in one of his last actions before Council adopted the resolution to remove him, repealed Chapter 14, Article VI of the 1984 Detroit City Code outlining the establishment, authority and operation of Citizen District Councils. Upon learning of the order, Councilwoman Sheffield immediately requested the Legislative Policy Division draft a report outlining the effects of the ordinance and analyzing the legality of such a repeal of rights granted by the State Constitution.

**DWSD Waterboarding???** 



After months of private negotiations between Mayor Duggan, Tri-County Executives and the Governor, Council was presented with the Great Lakes Regional Water Authority for its approval. The measure would lease, for 40 years, the parts of the system servicing the suburbs to the new authority. 900 of the the approximately 1,400 employees will now become GLRWA employees. The measure was passed by City Council by a vote of 7-2 with Council Member Sheffield and Council President Brenda Jones dissenting. Overall, Councilwoman Sheffield wanted to vet the proposal more and do her due diligence with respect to weighing all options before entering into any agreement.

**Telling Our Story!** 


