Fire Safety Checklist


✓ Install and maintain smoke alarms

- At least one on each level of your home, especially near sleeping areas
- Test and dust alarms monthly
- Replace batteries at least once a year



☑ In case of a fire

- Know two ways out of every room in your home and practice your escape routes
- Do not try to fight the fire get out immediately
- Call for help once outside your home
- Have a meeting place outside so everyone knows you are out of the building




☑ Use smoking materials safely

- If you smoke, never smoke in bed, when taking medication, or when consuming alcohol
- Always use large, tip proof ashtrays
- Store all matches and lighters in a safe place

☑ Pay attention to your cooking

- Keep pot handles turned inward
- Wear tight fitting clothing
- Use oven mitts or pot holders





✓ Heat your home safely

- Have a professional inspect your heating equipment annually
- Keep a distance of three (3) feet between heaters and any combustibles
- Do not use candles or ovens to heat your home

- Avoid using extension cords
- Plug each appliance into it's own outlet
- Install and maintain all electrical appliances in accordance with manufacturer's instructions
- Check plugs and cords for wear and breakage
