Located on the far northeast side of Detroit, Yorkshire Woods including Denby is just a few minutes away from Harper Woods and the Grosse Pointes. Under the Yorkshire Woods Community Organization, neighbors take part in building community gardens and other neighborhood revitalization efforts. The Yorkshire Woods Executive Board holds monthly block club meetings to talk about new ways of improving the Denby Community.

HOMES

This neighborhood has a collection of brick single-family homes. The typical house in Yorkshire Woods is a brick bungalow, although there are also many 2-story colonial brick homes.

SHOPPING

This neighborhood is close to over 20 grocery stores and accessible to retail shopping at the Mack-Alter Square. Residents can choose from over 20 restaurants to dine in.

SCHOOLS

Yorkshire Woods is home to the historic Denby High School. There are also over 18 schools nearby including the J.E. Clark Preparatory Academy and the award-winning Ronald Brown Academy.

HEALTH

Yorkshire Woods is close to several hospitals including the St. John Providence Hospital and the New Hope Medical Center.



SKINNER PARK

In 2016, Skinner Park received a \$14 million renovation. Over 10,000 volunteers mobilized to remove blight, board up 362 vacant houses and remodel 8 local homes. LOCATION

Located on the far northeast side of Detroit with Morang to the north, Whittier to the west, East Lakepointe Street to the south and Kelly Road to the east. Yorkshire Woods is near I-94 and only 20 minutes from downtown Detroit.

Located on the east side of Detroit, Morningside won the Most Outstanding Neighborhood Award in 2010. This neighborhood borders Grosse Pointe Park and has a mix of beautiful historic homes and recently constructed new houses.

Apart from facilitating beautification efforts in the community, local organizations are looking to attract new residents by making the neighborhood more immigrant friendly. There are plans to start ESL classes, multilingual tutoring/classes, and more.

HOMES

Known for its beautiful homes, Morningside has a collection of Tudor style and colonial houses. The typical Morningside home is a single-family colonial brick house.

SHOPPING

This neighborhood is close to retail shopping at the Mack-Alter Square and has five full service grocery stores.

Residents can choose from over 25 restaurants to dine in.

SCHOOLS

Morningside is home to great schools including the J.E. Clark Preparatory Academy and the award-winning Ronald Brown Academy.



HEALTH

Morningside is close to two hospitals including the St. John Hospital & Medical Center and two senior facilities. It also has two veterinarians.



THE HISTORIC ALGER THEATER

Currently being renovated by the Friends of Alger Theater Organization, the Alger Theater is a historical Art Deco structure located on Warren Avenue. While it is not open to the public, the Marquee can be rented to announce special announcements. The organization also hosts art projects and events throughout the year.



LOCATION

Located on the east side of Detroit with I-94 to the north, Alter Road to the west, Mack Avenue and Grosse Pointe Park to the south and Outer Drive to the east. Morningside is only 10 minutes from downtown Detroit with easy access to highway and public transportation.
