

MEETINGS AND ACTION PLAN

Due to Covid-19, the Greater Corktown Planning Framework Planning Process timeline has been slightly modified. Reflecting our new currently realities, we are now in the process of scheduling small group meetings to reveal the draft Framework recommendations and gather feedback. In addition, these draft recommendations will be posted online to the project website and a link will be included in the next edition of the newsletter. There will be various ways for residents to review the material and provide feedback.

We would like the community to understand that these recommendations are "draft" recommendations and are not final. Community members still have the opportunity over the next several weeks to influence the final recommendations of the plan. These next series of smaller meetings are part of the progression of overall planning process. Over the past months, we have engaged in smaller 1-on-1 meetings, pop-up meetings, and large workshops. The "draft" recommendations developed are based on all the aggregated feedback that was collected to date, as well as extensive internal vetting with other City Departments.
