GENERAL INFORMATION

On Tuesday, November 8, 2022, a General Election has been scheduled in Michigan for the purpose of electing candidates to federal, state and local offices. Proposal(s) will also appear on the ballot. Please use the Sample Ballot inside this newsletter to familiarize yourself with who and what you will be voting for.

Finally, your new voter identification card includes the following legislative districts: US Congress, State Senate, State House of Representatives, Wayne County Commissioners, Wayne County Community College Trustees, Detroit City Council and Detroit Board of Police Commissioners.

As a reminder, please refer to the back page of this newsletter to review your legislative districts that you will be voting in for the General Election.

REDISTRICTING AND YOU

The 2020 Census reported that Detroit now has 639,111 residents residing within its borders. Consequently, all legislative offices representing Detroit district boundary lines were adjusted to reflect the change in population. Prior to redistricting, Detroit had 503 voting precincts. As of August 2, 2022, our precincts were reduced to 450.

By now, every Detroit elector should have received a new voter identification card to reflect all legislative changes. Also, some voters may experience precinct and polling location changes. As such, please pay close attention to all of the information on your new voter identification card.

ELECTION UPDATE

During the August 2, 2022 Primary, the Detroit Department of Elections continued to make tremendous strides in improving Election Day operations. During the canvassing of election returns, the Wayne County Board of Canvassers reported that 98% of Detroit's 450 absentee voting precincts balanced and 95% of the regular precincts balanced.

In November, the Department will continue to work to improve our efforts to ensure that the democratic process is an operation all Detroiters can be proud of.

GENERAL ELECTION

TO VOTE: Completely darken the oval opposite each choice as shown:

IMPORTANT: To mark your ballot, use only a black or blue ink pen. **DO NOT USE ANY OTHER INK COLOR!**

PARTISAN SECTION: To vote the partisan section of the ballot, you may cast a "straight ticket," a "split ticket" or a "mixed ticket."

Straight Ticket: Vote the party of your choice. Nothing further need be done in the partisan section.

Split Ticket: You may vote a straight ticket AND vote for individual candidates of your choice.

Mixed Ticket: Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office.

NONPARTISAN and PROPOSAL SECTIONS of the ballot (if any) must be voted separately.

DO NOT vote for more candidates than indicated under each office title.

WRITE-IN CANDIDATES: To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write or place the name of that candidate in the blank space provided and completely darken the voting target area. **This must be done even if you cast a straight party vote.** Do not cast a write-in vote for a candidate whose name is already printed on the ballot for that office.

CHECK BOTH SIDES OF BALLOT: This ballot has two sides. Be certain to check the reverse side of the ballot.

WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING: Place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve so that votes cannot be seen and the numbered stub is visible. Return the ballot to the election official stationed at the tabulator. (If voting by absentee ballot, follow the instructions provided by the clerk for returning the ballot.)

NOTE: If you make a mistake, return your ballot to the election official and obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to erase or correct any marks made in error.

الانتخابات العامة

التصويت: املاً البيضاوي تماماً مقابل كل خيار كما هو موضح **هام:** لتعليم الاقتراع، استخدم قلم جبر أسود أو أزرق فقط. لا تستخدم أي لون آخر **القسم الحزبي:** للتصويت على القسم الحزبي في بطاقة الاقتراع، يمكنك الإدلاء بـ "بطاقة مباشرة" أو "بطاقة"مقسمة" أو "بطاقة مختلطة"

بطاقة مباشرة: صوت للحزب الذي تختاره. لا حاجة لعمل المزيد في القسم الحزبي

بطاقة مقسمة: يمكنك التصويت على بطاقة مباشرة والتصويت للمرشحين فرديين من اختيارك

بطاقة مختلطة: التصويت للمرشحين الفرديين من اختيارك في كل مكتب.

يجب التصويت على أقسام غير حزبية وقسم الاقتراع (إن وجد) بشكل منفصل. لا تصوت للمرشحين أكثر مما هو مذكور تحت كل منصب.

اكتب المرشحين: للتصويت لمرشح لم يُطبع اسمه على بطاقة الاقتراع، اكتب أو ضع اسم ذلك المرشح في المساحة الفارغة المتوفرة وقم بتعيين منطقتي التصويت تماماً. يجب أن يتم ذلك حتى لو أدليت بصوت حزبي مباشر. لا تدلي بصوت مكتوب لمرشح تمت طباعته اسمته بالفعل على بطاقة الاقتراع لهذا المنصب.

تحقق من جانبي البطاقة: هذا الاقتراع له وجهان. تأكد من التحقق من الجانب الآخر من بطاقة الاقتراع

عند إتمام التصويت: ضع بطاقة الاقتراع في غلاف السرية بحيث لا يمكن رؤية الأصوات ويكون كعب الاقتراع المرقم مرئياً. إعادة ورقة الاقتراع إلى مسؤول الانتخابات المتمركز في الجدول. (في حالة التصويت عن طريق الاقتراع الغيابي، اتبع التعليمات التي

قدمها الكاتب لإعادة الاقتراع)

ملاحظة: إذا ارتكبت خطأ، فأعد بطاقة اقتراعتك إلى مسؤول الانتخابات واحصل على بطاقة اقتراع جديدة. لا تحاول محو أو تصحيح أي علامات خطأ.

SECCIÓN PARTIDARIA: Para votar en la sección partidista de la boleta, puede emitir un "boleta directo," un "boleta dividido" o un "boleta mixto".

Boleta directo: vota el partido de tu elección. No es necesario hacer nada más en la sección partidista.

Boleta dividido: puede votar por boleta simple Y votar por candidatos individuales de su elección.

Boleta mixto: Vote por los candidatos individuales de su elección en cada oficina.

Las **SECCIONES NO PARTIDAS y DE PROPUESTA** de la boleta (si las hay) deben votarse por separado.

NO vote por más candidatos de los que se indican en cada cargo.

CANDIDATOS POR ESCRITO: Para votar por un candidato cuyo nombre no está impreso en la boleta, escriba o coloque el nombre de ese candidato en el espacio en blanco provisto y oscurezca completamente el área de destino de la votación. Esto debe hacerse incluso si emites un voto de partido directo. No emita un voto por escrito por un candidato cuyo nombre ya está impreso en la boleta para ese cargo.

MARQUE AMBOS LADOS DE LA BOLETA: Esta papeleta tiene dos lados. Asegúrese de revisar el reverso de la boleta.

CUANDO HAYA COMPLETADO LA VOTACIÓN: Coloque la boleta en el sobre secreto para que los votos no se vean y el talón numerado sea visible. Devuelva la papeleta al funcionario electoral que se encuentra en el tabulador. (Si vota con una boleta de voto ausente, siga las instrucciones proporcionadas por el secretario para devolver la boleta).

NOTA: Si comete un error, devuelva su boleta al funcionario electoral y obtenga una nueva boleta. No intente borrar ni corregir ninguna marca hecha por error.

সাধারণ নির্বাচন

ভোট দেওয়ার জন্য: প্রতিটি পছন্দ মতো করে ডিম্বাকৃতি পুরোপুরি অন্ধকার করুন:

গুরুত্বপূর্ণ: আপনার ব্যালট চিহ্নিত করতে শুধুমাত্র একটি কালো বা নীল কালি কলম ব্যবহার করুন। অন্য কোনও কালি রঙ ব্যবহার করবেন না!

পার্টিশন বিভাগ: ব্যালটের পক্ষপাতিস্বাকারী অংশটি ভোট দিতে, আপনি একটি "স্ট্রেট টিকিট", "বিভক্ত টিকিট" বা একটি "মিশ্র টিকিট" দিতে পারেন।

সোজা টিকিট: আপনার পছন্দের পার্টিকে ভোট দিন। পার্টিশন বিভাগে আর কিছু করার দরকার নেই।

বিভক্ত টিকিট: আপনি একটি সরাসরি টিকিট ভোট দিতে পারেন এবং আপনার পছন্দের পৃথক প্রার্থীদের ভোট দিতে পারেন।

মিশ্র টিকিট: প্রতিটি অফিসে আপনার পছন্দের পৃথক প্রার্থীদের ভোট দিন।

ব্যালটের নন পার্টিশন এবং প্রস্তাবিত বিভাগগুলি (যদি থাকে) আলাদাভাবে ভোট দিতে হবে।

প্রতিটি অফিসে শিরোনামের অধীনে নির্দেশিত চেয়ে বেশি প্রার্থীকে ভোট দিবেন না।

আপনি যখন ভোটিং সম্পূর্ণ করেছেন: ব্যালটটি গোপনীয়তার মধ্যে রাখুন যাতে ভোটগুলি দেখা যায় না এবং সংখ্যায়ুক্ত স্ট্যাবটি দৃশ্যমান হয়। ট্যাবুলেটোরে অবস্থিত নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তাকে ব্যালট ফিরিয়ে দিন। (অনুপস্থিত ব্যালটে ভোট দিয়ে থাকলে ব্যালট ফিরিয়ে দেওয়ার জন্য কেরানি প্রদত্ত নির্দেশনা অনুসরণ করুন।)

দ্রষ্টব্য: আপনি যদি ভুল করেন তবে আপনার ব্যালটটি নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তার কাছে ফিরিয়ে দিন এবং একটি নতুন ব্যালট পান। ত্রুটিযুক্ত কোনও চিহ্ন মুছে ফেলার বা সংশোধন করার চেষ্টা করবেন না।
