On June 28, 2022, the City Council approved a fiscal year 2021-2022 year-end closing budget resolution authorizing the Office of Budget to implement various budget transfers, within certain limitations, to remedy projected and potential appropriation shortfalls for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (fiscal year 2021-2022). An appropriation shortfall occurs when the City anticipates incurring expenditures in an appropriation account in excess of the amount appropriated by the City Council.

Honorable Detroit City Council Members:

Under State of Michigan Public Act 2 of 1968 (the "Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act") and the 2012 Detroit City Charter, the City cannot incur expenditures in an appropriation account in excess of the amount appropriated by the Detroit City Council.

The OCFO closely monitors expenditures throughout the year to manage and mitigate potential appropriation shortfalls. After reviewing projected year-end activity for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (Fiscal Year 2021-2022), the OCFO-Office of Budget is requesting authority to transfer unencumbered appropriation balances between various appropriations in Fiscal Year 2021-2022 and to continue certain spending authority into Fiscal Year 2022-2023, as outlined in the attached resolution.

We respectfully request your approval of the attached resolution before June 30, with a waiver of reconsideration, to ensure an effective close out of Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

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WHEREAS, Section 17(1) of State of Michigan Public Act 2 of 1968 (the "Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act") states that a deviation from the original general appropriations act shall not be made without amending the general appropriations act; and

WHEREAS, Section 18(3) of State of Michigan Public Act 2 of 1968 (the "Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act") states that an administrative officer of the local unit shall not incur expenditures against an appropriation account in excess of the amount appropriated by the legislative body; and

WHEREAS, Section 19 of State of Michigan Public Act 2 of 1968 (the "Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act") states that an the legislative body in a general appropriations act may permit the chief administrative officer to execute transfers within limits stated in the act between appropriations without the prior approval of the legislative body; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-210 of the 2012 Detroit City Charter authorizes that if during the fiscal year the Mayor advises the City Council that there are available for appropriation revenues in excess of those estimated in the budget, the City Council may make supplemental appropriations for the year up to the amount of the excess; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-211 of the 2012 Detroit City Charter authorizes that any time during the fiscal year upon written request by the Mayor, the City Council may, by resolution, transfer all or part of any unencumbered appropriation balance among the programs, services or activities within an agency or from one agency to another; and

WHEREAS, the OCFO-Office of Budget, on behalf of the Mayor, has provided the Detroit City Council with recommended appropriation changes necessary to address anticipated expenditures in excess of current appropriations as provided in this resolution; and.

WHEREAS, the City has current and planned contractual obligations funded in Fiscal Year 2021-2022 but anticipated to be paid in Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for which there is no appropriation in Fiscal Year 2022-2023, including a City Council retreat.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Detroit City Council hereby approves amending the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget by transferring appropriations as identified in the attached Schedule A; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, to ensure compliance with State law and to ensure the continued waiver of Financial Review Commission oversight, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may transfer, within the same department and fund, any unencumbered Fiscal Year 2021-2022 appropriation balance from one appropriation to another to address any Fiscal Year 2021-2022

expenditures in excess of appropriations that are identified subsequent to approval of this resolution; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, to ensure compliance with State law and to ensure the continued waiver of Financial Review Commission oversight, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may transfer, across departments within the same fund, from any Fiscal Year 2021-2022 unencumbered appropriation balance, up to \$1 million each, from one appropriation to another to address any Fiscal Year 2021-2022 expenditures in excess of appropriations that are identified subsequent to approval of this resolution; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, to ensure compliance with State law and to ensure the continued waiver of Financial Review Commission oversight, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may transfer, between the Local and Major Street Funds within the Department of Public Works, any Fiscal Year 2021-2022 unencumbered appropriation balance from one appropriation to another to address any Fiscal Year 2021-2022 expenditures in excess of appropriations that are identified subsequent to approval of this resolution; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may transfer unencumbered General Fund Fiscal Year 2021-2022 appropriation balances, up to a total of \$35 million, from such appropriations to the Risk Management Fund to support current and projected Risk Management Fund liabilities identified subsequent to approval of this resolution; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, additional revenues received and fund balances available in Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in excess of appropriated amounts for special revenue, enterprise, and any other restricted funds are hereby appropriated in fiscal year 2021-2022 for the purposes of such funds, subject to the approval of the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, shall provide a final report on any such Fiscal Year 2021-2022 appropriation changes, authorized hereinabove, to the City Council; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may use the Risk Management Fund for the payment of legal expenses incurred in fiscal years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 to mitigate losses that would otherwise be paid from the Risk Management Fund; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that, the unexpended balance at the end of fiscal year 2021-2022 in an appropriation with an open contractual obligation is hereby appropriated, up to the amount of such obligation, in fiscal year 2022-2023 for the same purpose, subject to the approval of assignment of such unexpended balance for such purpose by the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee; **AND BE IT FINALLY**

RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, is hereby authorized and shall take all appropriate actions necessary to implement the foregoing provisions and actions authorized by this resolution.
