**The cost to collect, treat and dispose of untreated sewage for each CCF of water used during a billing period. Eligible residential accounts with active meters will automatically receive the Average Winter Consumption (AWC) method each month for your sewage usage based on water usage in January-April. The AWC accounts for watering lawns, flowers, plants and gardens that occurs in warmer months.

***Residential properties receive an automatic green credit of 25% on the drainage charge with the assumption that you have redirected your downspouts to run onto your lawn instead of directly into the sewer. Non-residential properties also have the opportunity to reduce your drainage charge by improving onsite stormwater management – visit www.detroitmi.gov/drainage to learn more.
