



Former Hannan Memorial YMCA & Detroit Job Corps

10401 E. Jefferson

Opened in 1927, the Hannan Memorial YMCA building once housed a recreational center for youth and later was used as a job corps center for Detroiters. The building has been vacant since 1999. After years of neglect by private owners, the structural damage is significant and much of the building's roof is gone. The building is slated for demolition.

4600 Chalmers, located on the city's east side, was once a family-owned mechanic and tire shop before being abandoned. Over the years, it grew to be an eyesore at the corner of Chalmers and Canfield. This structure, which was surrounded by overgrowth and a dumping ground for trash in the neighborhood, is now removed. It's one of many commercial properties the City of Detroit's Construction & Demolition Department is targeting for removal using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) dollars.
