



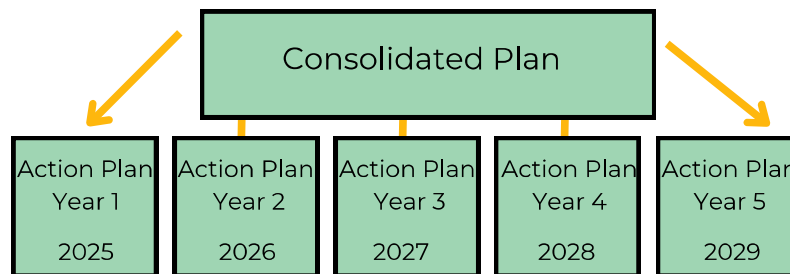
# Housing and Revitalization Department Consolidated Plan Education Series

## HUD Consolidated Plan

As we are just months away from the start of a new year, the City of Detroit’s Housing & Revitalization Department (HRD) is already planning for 2025 and beyond!

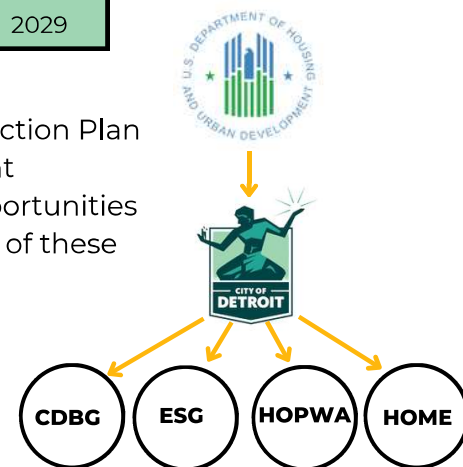
Every five years, the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires HRD to submit a Consolidated Plan (Con Plan). The Con Plan helps the city assess and prioritize its housing and community development. These needs could include improving the local parks, funding more youth programs, or providing more daycare facilities. Furthermore, it is meant to assist the City with understanding how it will spend its annual funding from HUD.

For each of the 5 years, HUD requires the City to submit an Annual Action Plan. This plan tells HUD and our constituents how we plan to spend our money each year, and how it aligns with the priorities laid out in the Con Plan.



The annual HUD funding outlined in our Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan include: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Home Investment Partnership (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDs (HOPWA) programs.
