ShotStoppers: Community Violence Intervention (CVI)

- From Aug. – Oct. 2024, every CVI group achieved a reduction in homicides and non-fatal shootings ranging between 37% to 83%.
- 5 of the 6 groups saw reductions large enough to earn performance grants.
- Non CVI zones saw a 35% drop in crime.



ACE Arts Alley

Old Redford neighborhood Arts Alley at Artist Village has opened; it is one of nine alleys being transformed as part of an initiative to design and redevelop several neighborhood alleys into unique community gathering spaces and centers of activity featuring local artwork.



Our Air Support Unit Got Upgraded

The Detroit Police Department unveiled its new \$2-million helicopter this summer. This new aircraft is equipped with the latest technology to help us track fleeing vehicles and monitor large crowds.

Neighborhood Beautification Program

- 100 neighborhood associations, block clubs, faith-based groups and non-profits have received grants of up to \$15,000 for various beautification projects.

Down Payment Assistance Program

Provides qualifying Detroit residents grants of up to \$25,000 for a down payment on a home.

Designed to ensure long-term employment success for Detroiters who have been out of the workforce for six months or longer. The program offers options to **upgrade skills** through job training, education programs, or work experience, job readiness training, financial literacy coaching, and individualized mentoring.

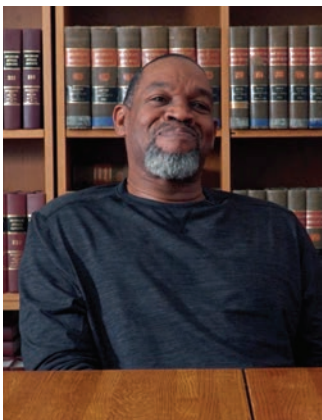

Neighborhood Opportunity Fund (NOF)
