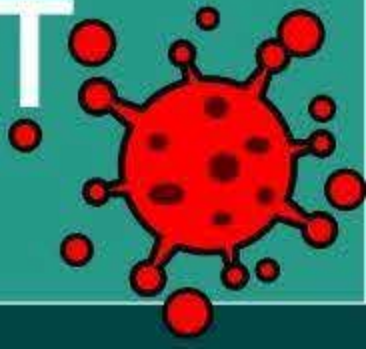




# MPOX (MPV) FACTSHEET



People with mpox should remain in isolation until all symptoms resolve, including the rash.  
Symptoms can last up to **4 weeks**.

## IF YOU HAVE MPOX AND ARE UNABLE TO FULLY ISOLATE THROUGHOUT ILLNESS:

Until **all** symptoms resolve, remain isolated in the home, away from others:

- Avoid close or physical contact with people and animals
- Cover lesions, wear well-fitting masks, and avoid public transportation. Only leave the home as required for medical care or an emergency
- Keep shared spaces and items clean and disinfected between uses

## UNTIL ALL SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS HAVE FULLY RESOLVED:

- Do not share clothing or linens. Launder and disinfect items and surfaces frequently
- Avoid physical contact, including sex and/or close intimate contact with people
- Do not share utensils or cups. Clean and disinfect used items
- Avoid large crowds
- Wash hands often with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer, especially after direct contact with the rash

## WHAT WE KNOW:

- Anyone can get mpox
- Exposures come from direct or close contact with someone infected or through contact with items used by someone infected
- Symptom onset begins as late as **21 days after exposure**. Individuals should monitor their symptoms if they've had a close contact with someone infected

## WHO CAN GET VACCINATED?

- Vaccination (Jynneos - 2 doses) is available to all ages under the following criteria:
  - **individuals with no known exposure**, but reside in settings where MPV is known to spread. Examples include:
    - members of the same household
    - those engaging in high-risk sexual activity
    - those in crowded settings such as concerts or educational institutions
  - **individuals with known exposure** who want to prevent MPV infection
- Vaccination is not offered after onset of symptoms.
