• The Isaac Agree Memorial Society was established to support & enhance the role of traditional Judaism in Detroit. •



ROSEDALE COURT

• IAMS met & held services in a house in Detroit's North End, sharing the space with the Torah Talmud. •



• IAMS moved to the corner of Griswold & State streets in Capitol Park. •



ISAAC AGREE DOWNTOWN SYNAGOGUE

• The Capitol Park building was officially named the Isaac Agree Downtown Synagogue. •



NOMADIC SHUL

• After the synagogue was demolished, the congregation used various temporary locations for its services. •



FINALLY HOME

• IADS moved into its current location, the former Fintex Men's Clothing store at Griswold & Clifford. However, Jewish residents & businesses were beginning to leave the city. •

 No longer able to sustain twice-daily worship services,
IADS cut back to holding only
Shabbat and holiday services.
